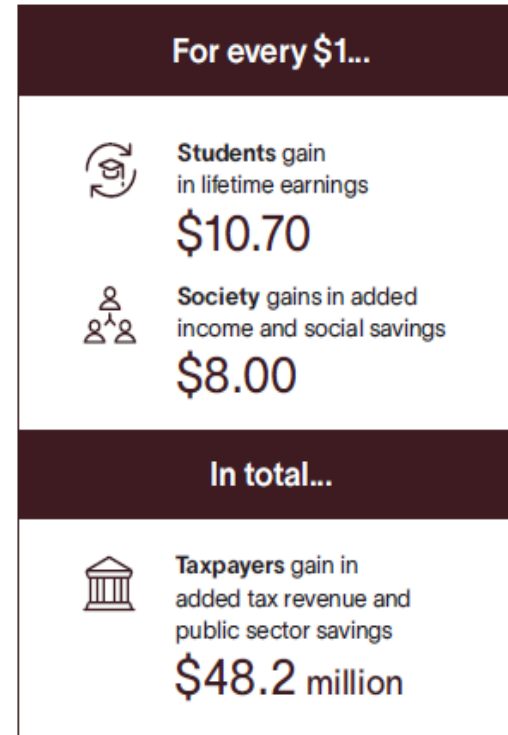


# Economic Impact Study

[The Economic Value of Compton College](#) report proves the impact of Compton on the regional economy and the return on investment for students, taxpayers, and society

In **Fiscal Year 2021-2022**, Compton College generated over \$200 million in spending throughout our service area.

- \$34,500,000 spent on daily college operations
- \$1,700,000 spent on construction and facilities maintenance to meet growing educational demands
- \$1,300,000 provided as direct aid to students
- \$162,500,000 of income earned by Compton College alumni employed in the regional workforce

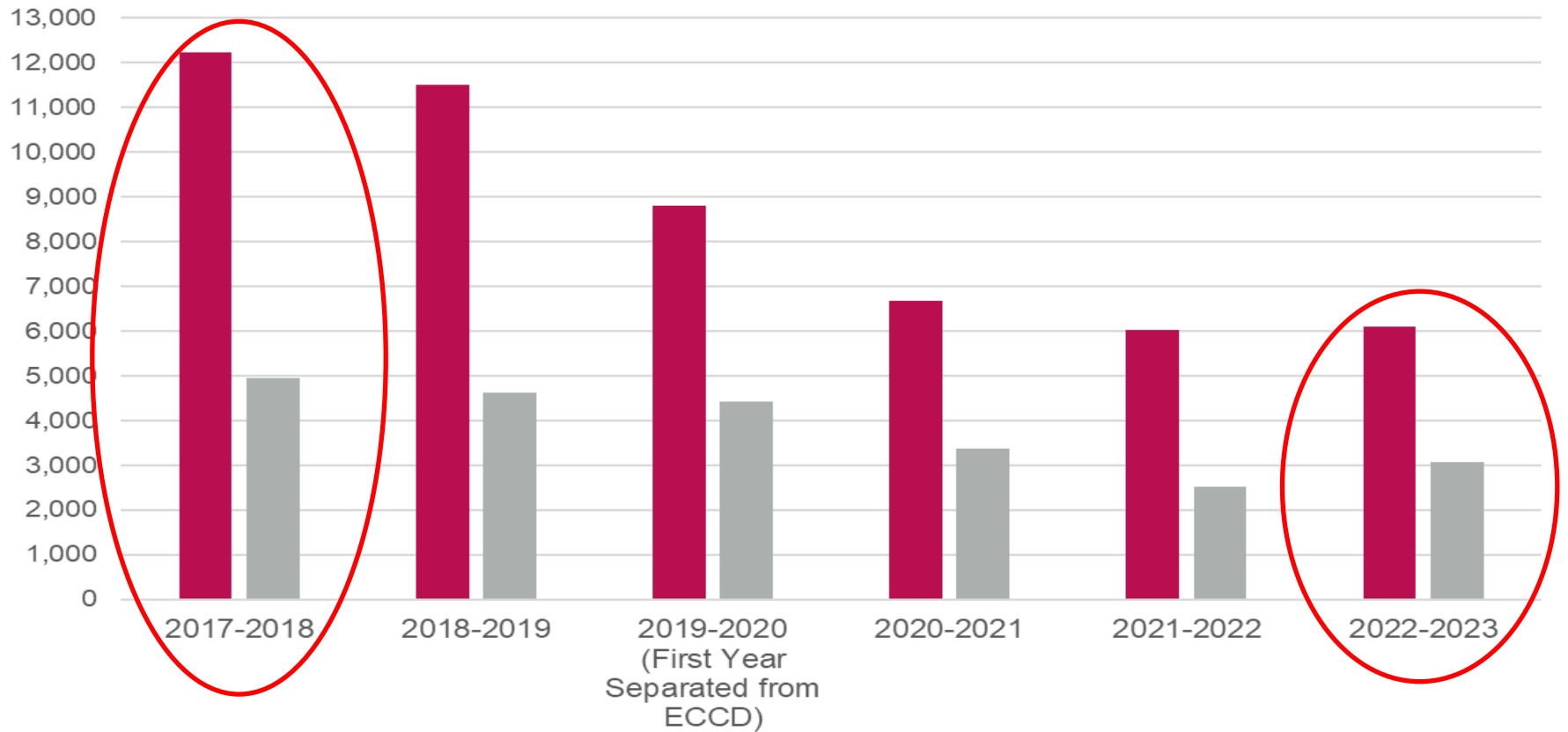

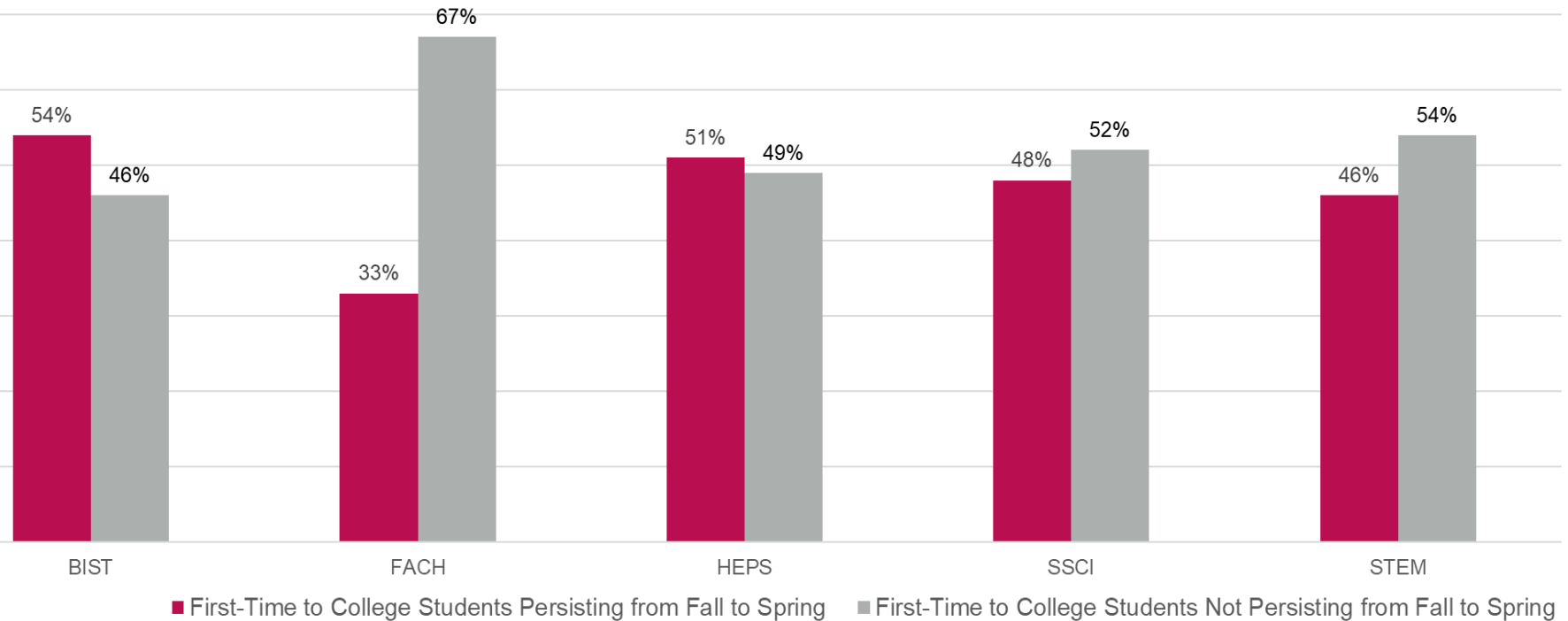

# Progress for First-Time Students by Guided Pathway Division

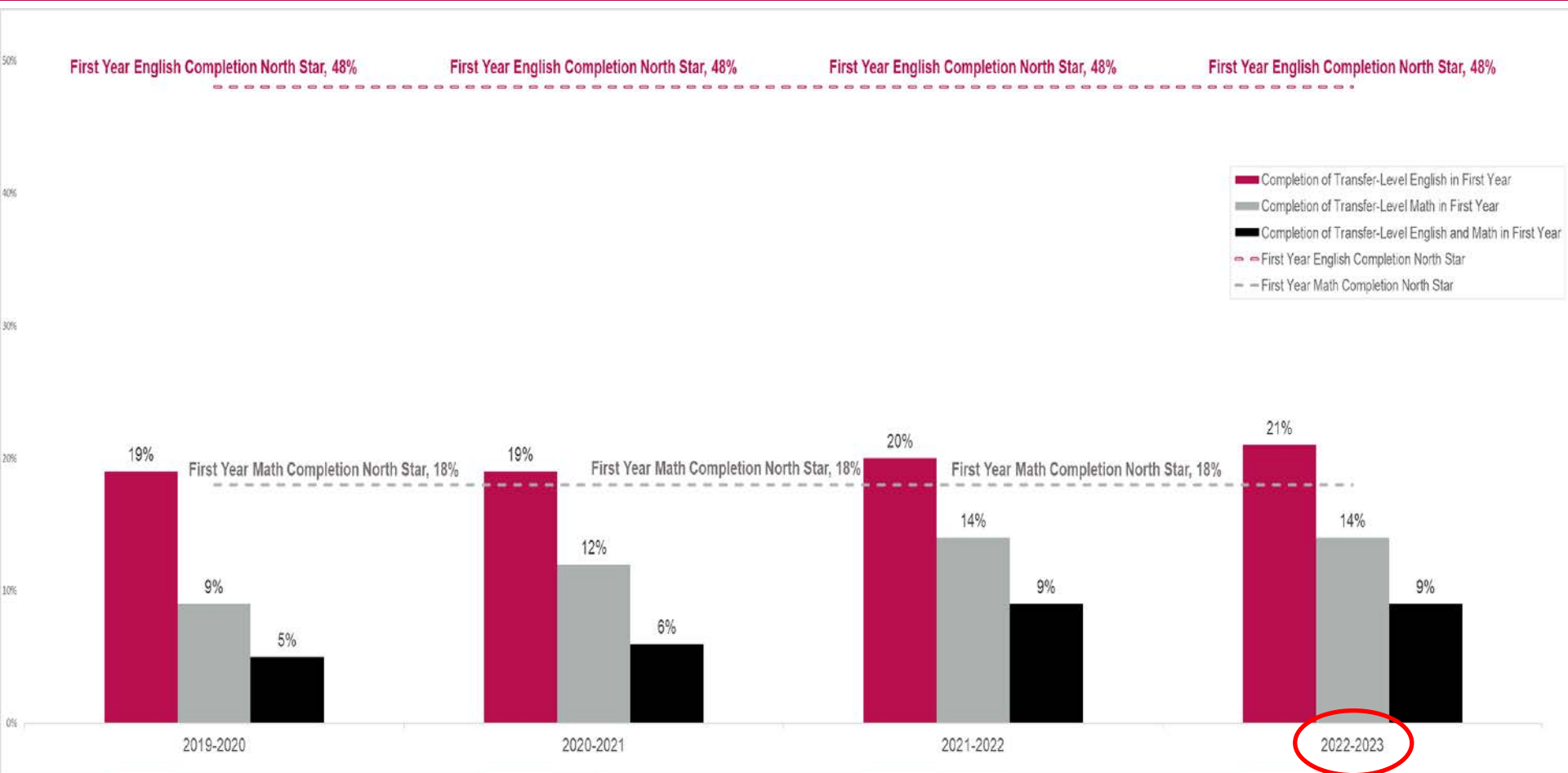
Fall 2022 to Spring 2023 Persistence

# All New Students' Completion of Gateway English and Math in Year One

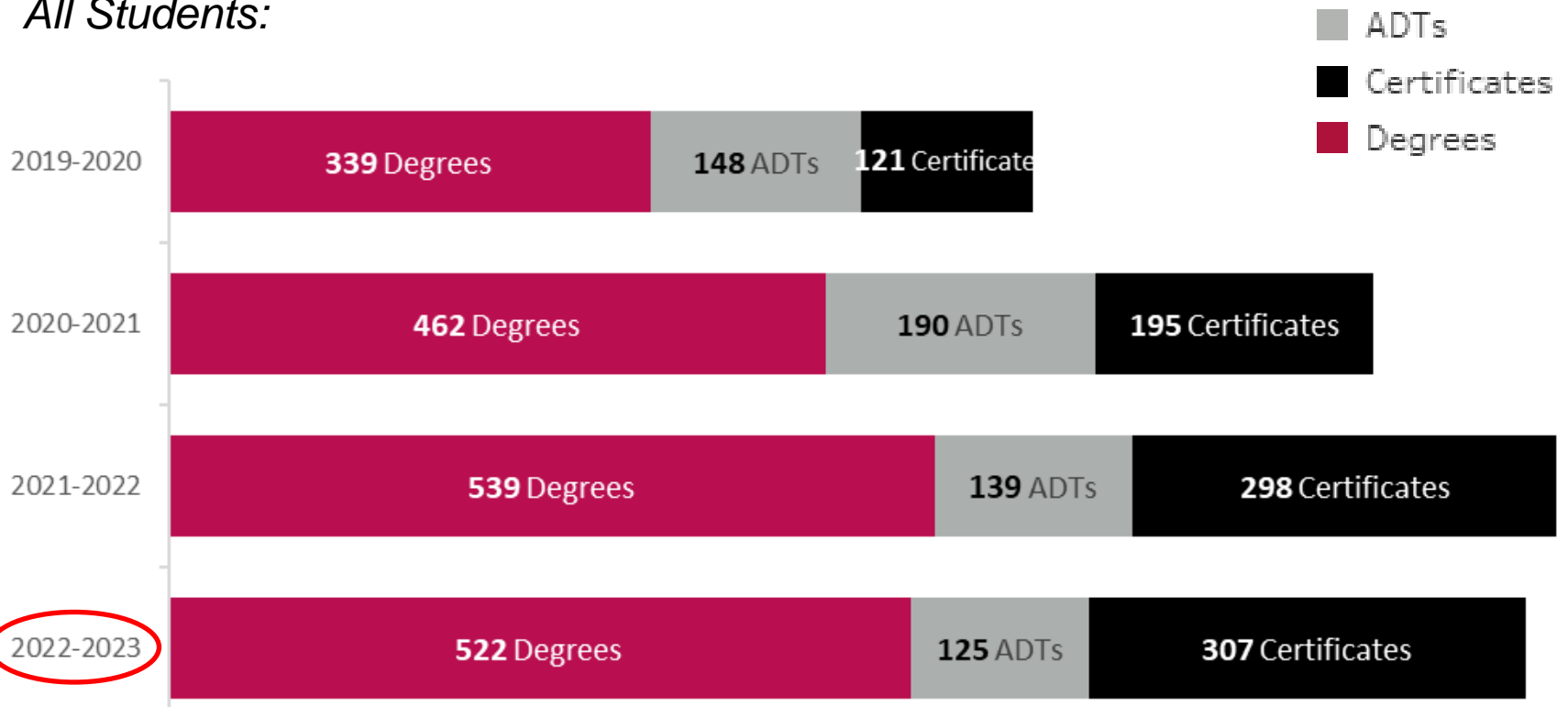

## Timeline

  - Open Forum: Tuesday, Feb. 20 from 2:30-3:30 p.m. in AHB 119
  - Exit Report: Wednesday, Feb. 21 from 11:00 a.m. to Noon in AHB 119
- **June 2024** – Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) Action

## Core Inquiries

- Core Inquiry 1**      The team recognizes the CEO's dynamic role in establishing and leveraging strategic partnerships with organizations within the institution's service area to support student success.
- Core Inquiry 2**      The team is impressed with the robust, centralized culture of care and support Compton College delivers to its students through instructional and student support services.

# Current Construction Projects

**Instructional Building 2:** The \$25.6 million project involves the removal of Row Building D, and the remainder of Row E and F buildings, and construction of a second state-of-the-art instructional building on campus.  
Estimated Completion: ***Spring 2024***



# Future Construction Projects

**Compton College Physical Education Complex:** This \$52 million project includes the demolition of the current gymnasium, men's shower/locker, classroom V, pool service, pool, and women's shower/locker buildings; and the construction of a new gymnasium, men's and women's locker room, faculty office space, and physical education support space. Estimated completion: **Spring 2026**



# Future Construction Projects

**Compton College Student Housing:** On June 26, 2022, California lawmakers moved to include a student housing grant totaling \$80,389,000 in the 2022-2023 State Budget for the Compton Community College District (CCCD) to build its proposed 250-bed student housing facility on the Compton College campus. Estimated completion: **Fall 2026**



# Facilities Bond Feasibility Study

## Potential \$150 Million Facilities Bond

On ***December 12, 2023***, the Compton CCD Board of Trustees approved a resolution authorizing a feasibility study of local school funding opportunities, including a local Proposition 39 bond election in ***November 2024***.

The public opinion study will obtain additional financial and legal information, as well as community input regarding the facility and technology needs of the District.

# Scholarship Program Expansion

- The Financial Aid Office and Foundation for Compton Community College District developed an expansion plan for the Compton College Scholarship Program using the \$400,000 set aside from the Intelcom settlement.
- The goal was to increase the available award amount to more than \$80,000 each year for the next five years.
- Several new scholarships, including scholarships for students transferring to CSU, UC, and HBCU, **part-time students**, and all Guided Pathway Divisions were added.

  - Applicants are required to provide the name and email of a Compton College employee who can attest to their academic potential, in-class achievements, and the student's character.
