The President/Chief Executive Officer (CEO) shall establish a Calendar Committee. that includes representation from appropriate constituent groups. Also, the President/CEO, in consultation with the Calendar Committee, will develop an academic calendar that will be subject to negotiations with the District, before ~~and~~ submitting it for approval to the Board. An academic calendar ~~with~~ will have at least 175 days, or equivalent for a compressed calendar, of instruction and/or evaluation in order to qualify for full apportionment. ~~from the State School Fund.~~





## COMPTON COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS

**AR 4010 Academic Calendar

~~The Calendar Committee shall develop an academic calendar that will be subject to negotiations with the District as stated in Article 15.3 in the Faculty Federation CBA, and such negotiations shall take place no later than 30 calendar days before submission to the Board of Trustees.~~

As specified in Board Policy 4010 the academic calendar is subject to negotiations between the Compton Community College Federation of Employees (Certificated) unit and the District. The academic year consists of 175 days of instruction based on a standard 18-week calendar. Classes in the primary terms (fall and spring) are offered on a compressed academic calendar that is consistent with the Education Code's required 175 days of instruction.

As described in Administrative Regulation 2511 - Council and Committee Structure, the Calendar Committee shall develop and maintain at least a two-year academic calendar cycle for Compton College. The Calendar Committee will recommend the academic calendar to Consultative Council, which will then recommend to the President/Chief Executive Officer (CEO). Once the ~~President/CEO~~ Consultative Council acts and reports back to the co-chairs of the Calendar Committee, the academic calendar will then be used to begin bargaining with the Compton Community College Federation of Employees (Certificated) unit. Every attempt shall be made to negotiate instructional calendars no later than 30 calendar days before submission to the Board of Trustees. Once agreement has been reached through the bargaining process, the academic calendar will be forwarded to the Board of Trustees for review and approval.

The District shall be closed on all holidays legally mandated ~~and~~ in accordance with the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO).

- New Year's Day (January 1)
- Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day (Third Monday in January)
- Lincoln Day (February 12 *or see Note below*)
- Washington Day (Third Monday in February)

- Memorial Day (Last Monday in May)
- Juneteenth (June 19)
- Independence Day (July 4)
- Labor Day (First Monday in September)
- Veterans Day (November 11 *or see Note below*)
- Thanksgiving Day (Fourth Thursday in November)

Christmas Day (December 25)

When a holiday falls on a Sunday, the workday immediately following shall be deemed to

be a holiday in lieu of the day observed. When a holiday falls on a Saturday, the workday

immediately preceding shall be deemed to be the holiday in lieu of the day observed.

Employees follow the holidays negotiated in their respective collective bargaining agreements.

#### Federation of Employees Holidays

~~Holidays for members of the bargaining unit shall be as they appear in the Instructional Calendar.~~

~~Any day declared by the President of the United States as a public fast, thanksgiving, or~~

~~holiday, or any day declared a school holiday by the governor of the state or the Governing~~

~~Board of the District under state law, shall be a holiday for all members of the bargaining~~

~~unit. The college shall remain in session on all special or limited holidays appointed by the~~

~~President or the governor of the state.~~

#### Federation of Classified Employees Holidays

~~The following holidays will be observed by the classified employees: New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day, Lincoln's Day, Washington's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Admission Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving Day, Cesar Chavez Day, and Winter Holiday.~~

~~Cinco de Mayo, the Friday during Spring Recess, the Friday succeeding Thanksgiving Day, the day preceding Winter Holiday, and New Years Eve Day. Cinco de Mayo and Cesar Chavez Day shall be taken by affected unit members during the scheduled winter break on days determined by District administration. Unit members shall be notified of these scheduled days by November 15th of each academic year.~~

#### Other Holidays:

The Board of Trustees may declare other days to be holidays and close the college and offices when good reason exists while maintaining the 175 days of instruction

for the primary terms. These holidays include New Year's Eve day, the Friday of Spring Break, the day after Thanksgiving, and Christmas Eve day among others as determined through the consultative and bargaining processes.

Note: Per Education Code 79020, the District shall close on every day appointed by the United States President as holiday and not listed above. Some dates may differ as allowed by the CCCCCO guidelines.
