Compton Center and the NFL – Watch for it!

On April 5, watch for a bit of the NFL on our Compton Center campus! Reigning Super Bowl champion New York Giants linebacker Antonio Pierce will host a free football camp for youth ages 7-14 on our Tartar athletic fields.

Pierce plans to tour our athletic facilities and meet with our student athletes. Compton Mayor Eric J. Perrodin will also be on hand to greet the football standout.

More than 15 NFL athletes and 30 college athletes will join Antonio in support of his mission to improve the quality of life for youngsters in the Long Beach/Compton area. Previous NFL players participating include Rashad Bauman of the Cincinnati Bengals; Robert Royal, Marcus Washington and Brian Clark of the Washington Redskins; Brandon Manumaleuna of the San Diego Chargers; Jason Bell, Derrick Ward and Frank Walker of the New York Giants; Billy Davis, formerly of the Baltimore Ravens; Kenyon Rambo formerly of the Dallas Cowboys; and Matthew Hachette, formerly of the Jacksonville Jaguars.

“My aim is to promote self esteem through positive experiences like the football camp,” Pierce said in a statement. “I feel opportunities such as this can offer kids a chance to hear directly from their NFL heroes, that although they came from similar surroundings, hard work and determination helped them to achieve their dreams.”

Pierce grew up in Long Beach and attended Paramount High School. He played football at Mt. San Antonio College before being recruited by Arizona State University.

Our Public Relations and Marketing efforts operate year round, and now we are gearing up for our Summer/Fall 2008 campaign. Watch for our latest marketing efforts this spring, coming to a mailbox near you!

This spring, residents will open their mailbox and see Compton Center’s **Community Newsletter**. Full of campus news and information about Compton Center’s many programs, this newsletter is mailed to all residents of the Compton District each fall and spring, and distributed to high schools, libraries and at other community events.

An **enrollment postcard** will also be sent to district residents this spring, in addition to select zip codes outside the district where a significant number of students reside. In addition, postcards will be sent to currently enrolled students as a reminder of registration dates and deadlines.

Each semester we mail about 134,000 copies of the Compton Center class schedule to all Compton District homes. Schedules are also available on the Web and in locations throughout campus and the community.

Other promotions and advertisements include:

- **Posters/Flyers** – Posters are placed throughout campus promoting the second eight-week courses offered each semester.
- **Banners** – Time to register! Banners are posted around the campus perimeter and in cities throughout the district to promote registration.
- **Newspaper Ads** – Ads are placed in *Long Beach Press Telegram*, *Compton Bulletin*, *LA Sentinel*, and *La Opinion* to promote fall and spring registration. Ads also run in several four-year university newspapers to promote summer classes.
- **Radio Ads** – Ads air on four radio stations, both FM and AM, and in English and Spanish.
- **Bus Billboards** – Ads are placed on buses with routes throughout the district and surrounding area, promoting fall and spring registration.

- **Billboards** – Compton Center billboards in three key locations throughout the district promote fall and spring registration.

Student Survey

About 40 Compton Center classrooms will participate in a National Survey of Student Engagement this spring. This survey will investigate student engagement at Compton Center and will help us assess the quality of our educational programs and student services and identify areas in which we can improve.

Research shows that the more actively engaged students are — with faculty and staff, with other students, with the subject matter — the more likely they are to learn and to achieve their academic goals.

Surveys will be administered to students in a random selection of classes on campus. In addition, faculty will be asked to complete a parallel survey (Community College Survey of Faculty Student Engagement, or CCFSSSE) to learn faculty perspectives on student engagement at El Camino College. The CCFSSSE is an online survey. Notice of this survey will be distributed later this spring.

We will use survey results to provide information about institutional performance to a variety of audiences, identify necessary improvements, and monitor our progress in achieving student success. Results from the survey will be published in late summer.

The Community College Student Report is administered by the Community College Survey

of Student Engagement (CCSSE), headquartered at the Community College Leadership Program at The University of Texas at Austin.
