HISTORY OF COMPTON COLLEGE

The Compton Community College District was established in 1927 as a component of the Compton Union High School District. In 1950, voters approved a bond issue separating the college from the high school district. Construction of the new college campus was completed on the present site. Classes began on the new campus in fall 1956.

The Compton Community College District encompasses an area of about 29 square miles, making educational services available to about 307,000 residents of Compton, Lynwood, Paramount and Willowbrook, as well as portions of Athens, Bellflower, Carson, Downey, Dominguez, Lakewood, Long Beach, and South Gate. Today, approximately 208 full- and part-time faculty teach 43 degrees, 31 certificates of achievement, nine certificates of accomplishment, and seven noncredit certificate programs.

In June 2005 the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) revoked Compton College's accreditation, and the college operated in partnership with the El Camino Community College District for the next 12 years. College administrators, faculty, and staff worked tirelessly during the partnership to achieve accreditation and independence. In June 2017, the ACCJC granted Compton College accreditation, and in June 2019, the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office recognized Compton College as an independent college.

Compton College is accredited by the ACCJC of the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), an institutional accrediting body recognized by the Commission on Recognition of Postsecondary Accreditation and the U.S. Department of Education.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Dr. Su Jin Jez

Dr. Su Jin Jez serves as CEO of California Competes, an organization that develops nonpartisan and financially pragmatic recommendations for improved higher education and workforce policies and practices across California.

Prior to joining California Competes, she served as an Associate Professor of Public Policy and Administration at California State University, Sacramento. She also served as the Director of the CSU Student Success Network, Academic Advisor for the California Executive Fellows Program, and Associate Director of the Sacramento State Doctorate in Educational Leadership.

Su Jin is an accomplished researcher whose work appears in a variety of publications including *Teachers College Record*, *Education Policy Analysis Archives*, *Research in Higher Education*, *Community College Review*, and *Michigan Journal of Race & Law*. Through her applied research, she has provided guidance to the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office, the California State University system, and California's Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education. Su Jin led a large-scale study of the CCCCCO's Economic and Workforce Development Program and coauthored multiple reports analyzing the role of the California Community Colleges Career Technical Education in the college completion agenda. She has presented across the country and internationally on key issues in higher education and systems change, including economic and workforce development, college readiness and success, student college choice and decision-making, and institutional effectiveness.

She currently serves on the following boards and councils: California's Cradle-to-Career Data System Governing Board, The Graduate! Network's Board of Directors, Tipping Point Community's Leadership Council, Credential Engine's Board of Directors, the Every Learner Everywhere Equity Advisory Board, the Campaign for College Opportunity's Policy Research Advisory Board, and the West Contra Costa Unified School District's Local Control Accountability Plan Committee.

She holds a PhD in education administration and policy analysis and an MA in economics from Stanford University. She received a BA in statistics and a minor in public policy from the University of California, Berkeley.

Armando Arguello

Associate degree candidate Armando Arguello is honored to be selected as the student speaker for the 2023 Commencement Ceremony at Compton College. Arguello is a Compton native and the oldest of three siblings. He is student-athlete who is known for working as hard on the baseball field as he does in the classroom.

Arguello will pursue his bachelor's degree in liberal arts, with a concentration in behavioral and social science, while also fulfilling his childhood dream of playing collegiate baseball. He hopes to one day return to Compton College to serve as an academic counselor, helping students achieve their academic and career goals.

Arguello's message today focuses on the premise that each person will have a different path to success. Some people will face more adversity than others, and Arguello hopes his speech will encourage everyone to remain strong and positive through rough times. He admits there are times where he has felt like the standards people hold him to are too high, yet he continues to work on being a better person every day. He strives to not only fulfill these standards, but often sets the bar even higher.

Compton College has provided a safe space for Arguello to explore his interests, both on and off the field. During the past three years at Compton College, he has earned three associate degrees for transfer, five associate degrees, two certificates of achievement, and a 4.0 GPA. Arguello has held the position of pitcher for the Compton College baseball team, and says he is grateful for everything that has come of his decision to attend Compton College. He was named to the Dean's List, selected as a Scholar Athlete of the Year, and awarded a Presidential Scholarship. Arguello would like to recognize the many coaches, instructors, counselors, and staff members at Compton College that have contributed to his success.
