Test Information

Tests are not timed, but the length of the entire test is approximately two hours. Although the tests are taken on a computer, no special knowledge of computers is necessary. Results are available immediately.

English Placement Test:

Consists of two sections: reading comprehension and sentence skills (writing).

Math Placement Test:

Consists of three sections: arithmetic, elementary algebra, and college-level math.

Ability To Benefit Test (ATB):

Consist of three sections: reading comprehension, sentence skills (writing) and arithmetic. Administered by appointment only. Federal restrictions limit the number and time students may take to retest. *The Financial Aid office must determine if a student is eligible for the ATB test.*

Cell Phones and Electronics

The use of cellphones and electronic media, including media-players, is <u>not permitted</u> in any of the testing rooms. All cellphones and electronic media must be turned off while testing. Students violating this rule may be asked to leave and their tests cancelled.
