By 1932, there were 38 junior colleges, by 1950 there were 50 colleges, by 1960 there were 64 colleges (and 56 districts)... Fresno City College was the first CA junior college (opened in 1910); in 1915, 8 of the 19 junior colleges in the U.S. were located in California (Azusa, Bakersfield, Fresno, Fullerton, Rocklin, San Diego, Santa Ana, and Santa Barbara). First District = Modesto in 1921.
