a) Fall 2020 CTE Return to Campus Plan

VP Berger advised that we are complying with all regulations and they are ever changing an fluid. It has not been decided upon as to when we will return to on campus instruction.

VP Berger provided an update on the reopening of the Child Development Center and what it would look like with COVID-19 restrictions and social distancing.

c) Spring 2021 Classes

VP Berger provided an update on the classes that will be allowed to meet on campus and those that will remain online for the Spring semester along with the possibility of adding other classes outside of the CTE classes being held on campus

3) Update Compton College Eventual Return to Campus Plan – Heather Parnock, Director of Community Relations

The Eventual Return to Work Draft Plan is ever changing, as soon as we have it handle on it things change. Heather provided updates on the Mailroom, the Return to Campus Draft Plan

Questions and concerns were asked about staff and students getting their test results and tests in a timely manner and being turned away by St. John's. These concerns were answered by Ms Sasser & Heather Parnock

4) Review of Follow-up Items from Previous Meeting(s)

a) COVID-19 Updates Area E

The General Board Meeting Packet 1 was uploaded to the chat and it has the Area E Updates

b) Review Emergency Operations Plan for Compton College District

Chief Box asked that everyone please review the Emergency Operations Plan, he knows it is dry, but it has a lot of information about safety, He is available to discuss it in detail over the phone.

5) Discussion Items/Reports

a) Reports from Compton College Pandemic Coordinators

Update given earlier in the meeting

b) Report from Compton Fire Department

Nothing has changed in the City, we have seen an increase in infections, but the rate is going down, and community exposure is still a threat. City Hall is still in normal operations. The Fire Department currently has 1 resource deployed on the Wildfires throughout the state. The City has had one fire and we have seen an abnormal in cardiac arrest cases, many want to wait it out because of COVID but then it is too late, because of COVID-19 you should look for an oxygen sensor and they can be purchased online and these devices can help determine the need to go to the hospital.

Flu season is coming it might be harsh for everyone. We are preparing for it. COVID19 is even affecting police and firefighters. We encourage everyone to stay distanced, use masks and hand sanitizer. The Department is working on plan for diversity and cultural awareness of the department to help them with current community needs and to bring a new approach by the department.

Anyone who has taken CPR training with the American Heart Association and their training expires in June of 2020 is having their expiration extended until October. The American Heart Association is not doing online training, but some instructions are conducting small in-person groups with 1 on 1 training.

c) Report from Compton Unified School District

Classes are still online, Los Angeles County has allowed for limited return of students, the District is working on a plan to bring student back. The plan will be less than 10% of students, staff back on campus, and we will still be giving away meals. St John's Medical Center now has an office in front of Compton USD's Main Office. The District has had a couple of cases of COVID-19, 1 District employee from the District Office has died from complications. Temperature guns are at all school sites, temperature checks are not mandatory but recommended and contact tracing is happening at all school sites and offices.

6) Pending Items

a) CPR First Aid – AED Training online update

Captain Ivan has volunteered to provide assistance in locating training and he will provide a written update in the future.

b) Questions

Chief Box encouraged all attendees to email in any questions they may have regarding any of the topics that were discussed during the meeting.

David Maruyama asked the following question: How will the District adapt if we get switched back and forth in terms of the color codes used in California? For example, I'm hearing San

Diego may have to go back to the most restrictive possibly.

Benson Atkins asked a question regarding the clarification of Essential Workers classifications once students are allowed to return to campus post COVID-19.

Denise Blood sent in the following question after the meeting for follow up: I have a question regarding what VP Berger spoke about in the Health, Parking, and Safety meeting today. She mentioned that the campus is looking to add a few on-campus classes, outside of the CTE area (CHEM, ART, COSM). If we proceed with this plan and more students are on campus will additional student services, that are currently remote, be asked to open to assist on-campus students? Also, by extension how would this then effect classified staff and who is considered essential.
