Library Advisory Committee Meeting Minutes

March 26, 2015

Minutes

The minutes from the September 25th meeting were approved unanimously

Virtual Meetings

Online discussions and virtual meetings were presented as options for members with crowded schedules as a follow-up to the issues previously discussed in September. CCC Confer and GoToMeeting (free) were offered as potential sources

Nursing Accreditation

New titles are needed. The publication dates should be 2013-present to address collection age concerns from the previous accreditation visit.

We plan to emphasize the currency of our databases: Journals@OVID, Health Source Nursing Academic, and Medline all have the most up-to-date information for nursing students. We also have an E-Book collection through EBSCO.

Ms. Pratt will provide a list of nursing titles to be ordered. In addition, a request was sent out for titles to our faculty.

Textbook Issues

Library reserves do not leave the library to go upstairs to SSC.

SSC has a collection of textbooks for tutors to use in sessions. The books do not leave SSC to be used in the Library.

Library Website

Changes were made to the Library's website over the summer.

More pathfinders will be added to the "Pathfinder" micro-site as needed.

Dr. Roach directs her students to the pathfinders for her classes, which were previously loaded on to the website.

Database passwords will be changed every fall

E-Books are now part of the EBSCO offerings.

PLATO Training

PLATO Courseware training would be held on April 15, presented by Elizabeth Melendez of PLATO. Mr. Jimenez remarked that the PLATO courseware was underutilized by faculty, and that the software costs \$25,000 per year.

SI Recruitment by SSC

New coaches and tutors are always welcome. This increases growth and subjects covered. English, Reading, and History coaches/tutors are sorely needed.

Dr. Roach asked about required levels and qualifications. Mr. Jimenez requests that all recommended students pass English 1A before applying to the program.

Dr. Bunting suggested that recommended students should also have a strong grasp of the nuances of their particular subject. Theory and process of application are also very important.

Mr. Jimenez said that it is crucial to share resources (ex. Notes, PowerPoint slides, etc.) as tutors are not the primary source for student learning.

Dr. Bunting suggested that faculty be recruited to do some tutor training in certain areas (i.e. critical thinking) through the SSC.

Mr. Jimenez also suggested that some of the students may have reading comprehension issues that complicate a tutor/coach's effectiveness.

TARTARS – Student Success Workshop Series

SSC offers a series of thematic workshops, mostly about maximizing tutor time and encouraging sustainable learning over time.

Outreach to various departments helped increase attendance.

A challenge is helping students overcome fears about asking for help.

Suggestions regarding instructional materials and programs are always welcome

Dr. Roach suggested a centralized campus calendar might help with the conflicting meetings issue.
