ABOUT ARTICULATION SYSTEM STIMULATING INTERINSTITUTIONAL STUDENT TRANSFER

ASSIST is the official repository of articulation and transfer information for California's public colleges and universities.

ASSIST maintains the following types of articulations:

- **Transferability Lists** display CCC courses that are transferable to CSU or UC, as well as which courses may be used to satisfy elective or general education requirements upon transfer. **Note: courses are only valid for the term & year in which they appear on these lists.**
- **Articulation Agreements** show how courses at a CCC may satisfy specific department or major requirements (or GE Breadth) at a CSU or UC campus

TRANSFERABILITY LISTS

Name/Type of List	Description
CSU Transferable Courses	Displays all courses that are CSU transferable for the Academic Year selected. No GE information is included.
CSU GE-Breadth Certification Courses*	Displays courses approved for CSU GE Areas; can filter by GE Area. No need to change the Academic Year.
CSU US History, Constitution, and American Ideals Courses (CSU AI)*	Displays courses approved to meet CSU AI. No need to change the Academic Year
IGETC for UC and CSU*	Displays courses approved for IGETC; can filter by GE area. No need to change the Academic Year.
UC Transferable Courses	Displays courses that are transferable to the UC. It also lists the courses' applicable UC Areas (B, E, H, M, S).
UC Transfer Admission Eligibility Courses	Displays courses approved for specific UC Areas; may be filtered by UC Area.

These Lists are historical and include **ALL courses ever entered into ASSIST, regardless of their current GE approval status; these lists include the term & year the course was approved or removed.*

ARTICULATION AGREEMENTS (MIDDLE PANEL)

- ❑ Search results defaults to **Major** Agreements, but may change to Department or Prefix (or GE Breadth).
- ❑ If an Agreement Type is unavailable, it will be greyed out
- ❑ The information is managed by the university (usually the Articulation Officer), not ASSIST

Compton College Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT)

ADT Tips & Reminders:

- Students must have a total of 60 CSU (or UC) Transferable Units.
 - Remember the double counting for courses may meet both Major and General Education Requirements.
- Below is a range of *possible* units needed for the ADT to reach 60 units. **Note: this is only a range; be sure to carefully examine students' coursework and ensure accuracy in adding the units.**

Counseling Tips when working with Transfer Students

California State University (CSU):

[Cal State Apply](#)

Minimum eligibility for admission for Upper Division Transfer Consideration:

- Completion of “Golden 4” = Area A1, A2, A3 and B4 of CSU GE pattern with “C-” grades or higher
 - [High-Unit Majors Authorized with Authorized Exceptions to Admission and GE Reqs](#)
 - [Golden Four Completion](#)
- 60 CSU transferable units w/ minimum 2.0 GPA
- 30 units of general education with overall 2.0 GPA or higher

A Degree with a Guarantee (ADT)

- Does not guarantee admission to a specific CSU, rather it guarantees admission to the CSU system
- ADT’s give priority consideration for admission to a CSU with a “similar degree”; specifically important in the university application process
- Help a student determine “similar degree”:
 - [CSU ADT Search Tool](#)
 - New site: [I Can Go To College](#) (formerly A Degree with a Guarantee)
- Considerations:
 - When an ADT is not an option ensure students are meeting required major prep for admission
 - An ADT is not always the best option (i.e. Elementary Teacher Ed)
 - Students must petition for ADT so that a student is e-verified by evaluator and given priority consideration for admission by CSU
 - Students who do not report ADT on CSU university application can get a “Verification of ADT” from a counselor:

Other CSU Notes

- CSU GE Certification is highly recommended though it is not an admission requirement; required for ADT
- Impacted CSUs and highly impacted majors look for completion of major prep; reference links below for more information on details regarding impaction and major specific required courses:

- Grades in repeated courses: if course was repeated at different institutions then most CSUs will average grades; **Unless** the transcript notes grade change (e.g. grade repeated “Not included in GPA”)
- Admission application site: **calstate.edu/apply**
 - Fall admission filing period= October 1-November 30th
 - Spring admission filing period= August 1-August 31st
- Most CSUs implement “Local Area”- priority consideration for admission based on the CCC applicant attended/has most units; CSULB determines based on high school graduated from (note: Compton Unified students are local to CSULB)
- The following universities have Supplemental Admission Applications: SDSU, CSULB, Cal Poly SLO and nursing programs and some fine arts programs require portfolio/performance

Counseling Tips when working with Transfer Students

University of California (UC)

UC for Counselors

- Minimum eligibility for Upper Division Transfer Consideration:
 - 60 UC transferable units with a minimum 2.4 GPA (2.8 for non-residents)
 - Seven-course pattern: 2 English composition courses (UC-E), 1 transferable math course (UC-M), and 4 courses chosen from two of the following areas- Physical/Biological Sciences, Arts/Humanities, or Social/Behavioral (reference IGETC) –Especially important for STEM majors
- **IGETC or breadth** required only for UC Berkeley College of Letters and Science majors and UC Riverside School of Business majors ...otherwise not an admission requirement but Highly Recommended for all majors Except STEM

Admission application

UC Admissions

- Personal Insight “Statements”- are a requirement of the admission process
- The Admission Application Update is required to be completed by all applicants sometime in January; will be notified by email with a link to Application Update site
- UC Merced is the only campus that may accept for Spring term (Semester campus)

Other UC Notes

- Transfer Admission Planner: great tool for any student considering UC transfer
- *Transfer Admission Guarantees (TAG)*: application filing period is September 1- September 30; students Must also follow up with general admission application in November
- Repeated courses of exact courses= UC will always take better grade even if course was repeated at different institution
- Most UCs are on Quarter system (Except Berkeley and Merced)
- UC Transfer Pathways:
 - Roadmap for Top 20 majors; will prepare prospective CCC students for these majors at all nine undergraduate campuses; Not a guaranteed admission program; more info at
- Transfer Pathways Guide: set of coursework that will fulfill coursework for multiple UC campuses

HBCU/Out-of-State Programs/CA Independent Universities

- Most will admit students with fewer than 60 transferable units; Though most require a minimum number of units (i.e. 30+ transferable units so that H.S. records are not considered in the admission process)

Advance Placement (AP) Exam

- Credit granted by Compton College is not the same as the credit that may be granted by university
- A score of 3 or higher on AP exam will grant GE area credit (i.e. UC Area 3B or CSU C2)
- AP credit for GE subject area is different from course equivalent credit
- Must reference specific university AP chart to determine if student can use AP credit for major prep; quick links can be found at ccctransfer.org website or university catalog/site

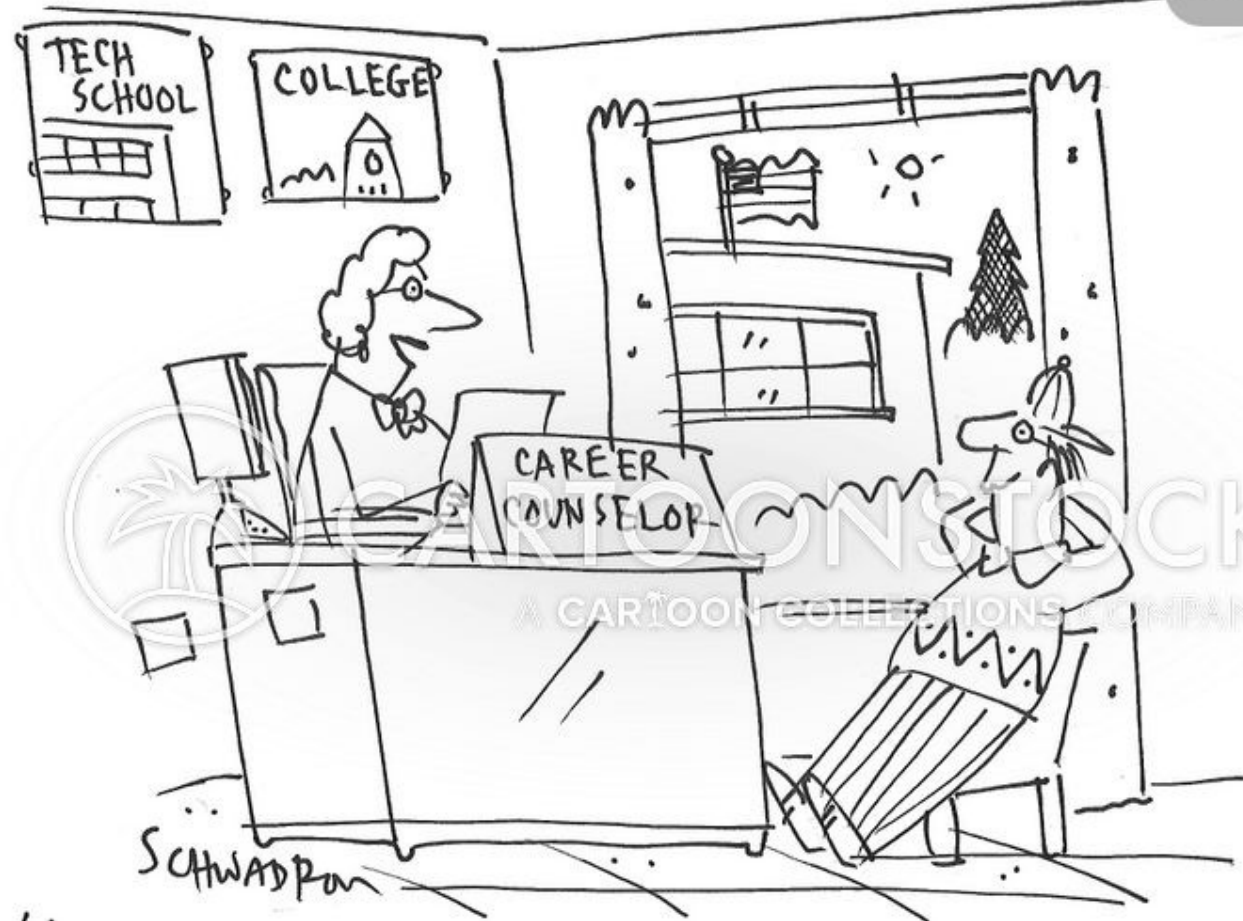

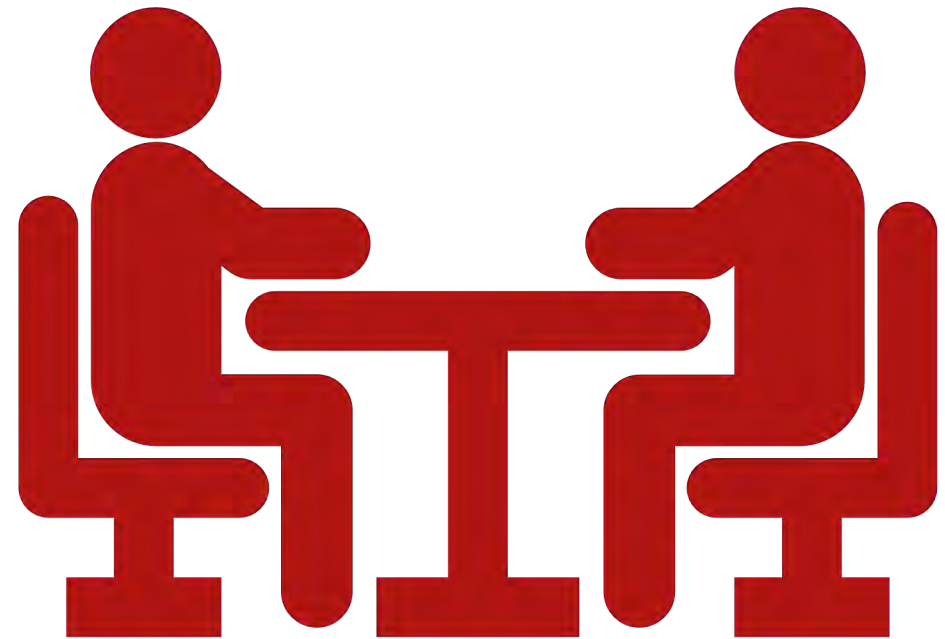

Career Counseling Framework

Connect	Reflect and Explore
Discover	Assessment and Evaluation
Progress	Gain Skills and Experience
Transition	Enter your Career and/or Continue Education

Pair and Share Activity (20 minutes)

- ▶ How do you help students identify where they may be in the Career Development Process?
- ▶ Partner with another counselor
 - ▶ Discuss how you assist students in identifying areas of opportunity as it relates to Career Counseling.
 - ▶ Ex- How do start your conversations related to career?
 - ▶ Do you have a process for identifying where is a student might be within the typical phases of Career Counseling?
- ▶ Share your partners approach to Career Counseling with the larger group



Connect: Reflect and Explore

- ▶ 1st appointment
- ▶ Intake review
 - ▶ Prior Assessment
 - ▶ Interest Areas
- ▶ Open-ended Questions and Conversation
- ▶ Begin the exploration phase
 - ▶ Showcase Compton College Guided Pathways
 - ▶ Confirm major and academic goal
 - ▶ Determine initial assessment



Best Practice: Use Open-ended questions to identify where students are in the Career Development Process

- Why did you choose your major?
- Are you currently working in a field related to your career goal?
- What other experiences have you thought about?
- Have you thought about looking into an internship?
- What kind of things do you do for a hobby?
- What types of things do you enjoy being a part of for fun?
- Can you tell me about any volunteer or career experiences from high school?
- Have you thought about the types of work environments or salaries you'd like to enjoy one day?

Discover: Assessment and Interpretation

- ▶ 2nd appointment
 - ▶ Begin assessment process
 - ▶ Situation-specific
 - ▶ Assessment options
- ▶ 3rd Appointment
 - ▶ Begin assessment interpretation

Why use Career Assessments?

- ▶ Assessments can be excellent relationship building tools between students and counselors.
 - ▶ Relationships are CRITICAL in developing a culture of student success.
- ▶ Assessments can provide critical information related to career regardless of where a student might be in the career development process.
 - ▶ Ex: Personality and institutional fit, salary potential, skills match, exploration of job/career titles etc
- ▶ Assessments are an excellent catalyst for future student contact/counseling apts.
- ▶ Can be extremely useful on deciding and solidifying a student's major.

Best Practices: Assessment Implementation

▶ Initial Assessment Apt

- ▶ Set expectation of assessment and need for multiple appointments (2-3) with student.
 - ▶ Let the student know that this is a process, and it's ok if they are unable to figure out their entire life/career goals in a single counseling apt!!!
 - ▶ Career Assessments are only one tool in a larger counseling toolbox.
- ▶ Explain purpose and learning outcomes of assessment.
- ▶ Review Assessment Components or keys to successful assessment completion.
 - ▶ Many assessments such as the MBTI and STRONG have very specific directions in terms of mindset and how to students should approach career assessments. Don't skip these steps!!!
- ▶ Explain how to access Assessment (ex: Elevate, Eureka, et al)
- ▶ Have student either complete assessment right away or give a short window for student to complete (24-72 hours).
- ▶ Immediately book follow up apt to complete assessment interpretation.

Best Practices: Assessment Interpretation

- ▶ Make sure to save and provide copies of assessment to student (virtual and in-person).
- ▶ Be sure to follow assessment guidelines for interpretation (ex: MBTI, Strong, True Colors etc. all have detailed best practices for interpretation).
- ▶ TAKE YOUR TIME! Career assessment results are loaded with complicated and detailed information.
 - ▶ Be sure slow down and review the information in a way that is easily absorbed by the student. Rushing through results will can overwhelm students resulting in a negative experience.
 - ▶ Do not assume students know or understand common career related terms (ex: outlook, job growth, earning protentional, salary, upward mobility etc). What is common sense for you may not be common sense for your students.
 - ▶ Make the experience as positive and fun as you can!
- ▶ Have a list of questions ready to help students further explore and process assessment information. Examples:
 - ▶ Did you find the assessment results useful?
 - ▶ How do you plan on using this information going forward in your education or career?
 - ▶ Which components of the interpretation did you most relate to?

Best Practices Cont'd: Assessment Interpretation

- ▶ Assign homework or follow-up activities- Ask students to research some of the findings from the Career Assessment.
 - ▶ Ex: Have a student look for a job as if they have a degree/certification already! What additional requirements do employers want? What type of degrees or certificates are they looking for? What kind of experience do they want? What types of salaries are available? Where are these jobs located?
 - ▶ Follow-up activities help students become more fluid with career assessment and related research tools.
 - ▶ Helps counselors' reverse engineer education plans based on students' research and insights.
 - ▶ Opportunity for students to take ownership of their educational and career journeys.



Progress: Gain Skills and Experience

- ▶ Follow-up appointment
 - ▶ Continue assessment interpretation
 - ▶ Continue exploration based on assessment results
- ▶ Recommend HDEV115
- ▶ Discuss Hard/Soft Skills
- ▶ Seek Internship and/or volunteer opportunities
- ▶ Informational Interviewing
- ▶ Set SMART Goals

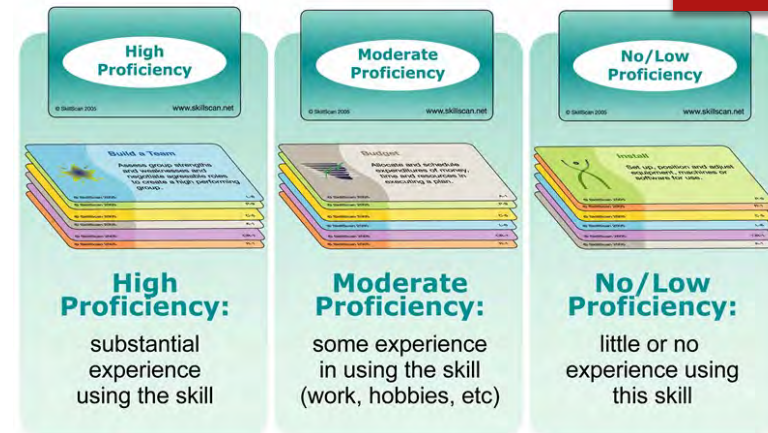

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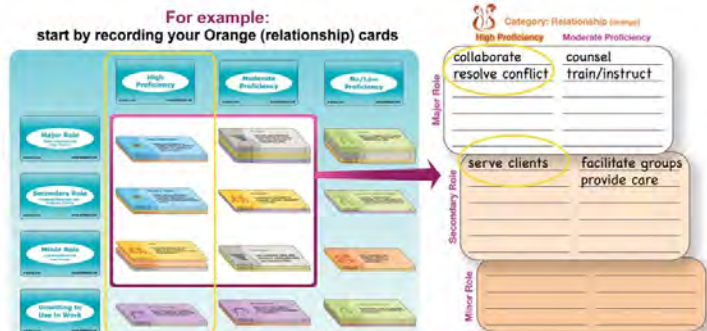

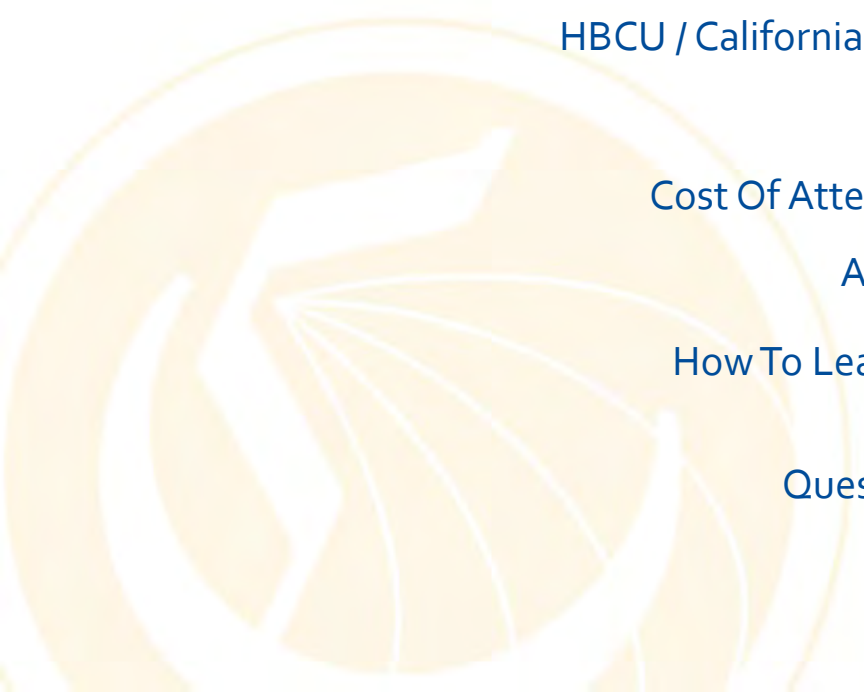

HISTORY OF HBCU'S

- **The first Historically Black Colleges (HBCUs) were established prior to the Civil War.**
 - Cheyney University of Pennsylvania (1837)
 - Lincoln University in Pennsylvania (1854)
 - Wilberforce University in Ohio (1856).
- However, most Historically Black Colleges and Universities were established after the American Civil War. By 1902, 85 HBCU's had been established.
- Currently there are 105 Historically Black Colleges and Universities located mainly in the South and on the East Coast.
- HBCU's were established because most Colleges and Universities denied admission to **African Americans**.

HBCU Facts

- How Many African Americans Are HBCU Graduates?
 - 22% of Bachelors Degree Holders
 - 40% of Members of Congress
 - 12.5% of CEO's
 - 40% of Engineers
 - 50% of Professors at Non-HBCU Institutions
 - 50% of Lawyers
 - 80% of Judges

WHY CONSIDER A HBCU?

- HBCU's (37.8%) are doing a better job of graduating low-income Black students than PWI's (32%).¹
- About 55% of Black HBCU graduates said they "strongly agreed" that their HBCU "prepared them well for life outside of college," compared to less than 30 % of non-HBCU Black graduates.²
- While 20% of Black graduates who did not attend an HBCU said they were "thriving in financial well being," 51% of Black HBCU graduates reported doing so.²

WHY CONSIDER A HBCU?

- Black graduates from HBCUs are more likely to have a mentor who encouraged their goal and a professor who cared about them as a person.¹
- Alumni are more likely to have a job or an internship where they apply what they learned.¹
- HBCU's offering Engineering graduate African Americans at a rate of 62% to 94%, while PWI's graduate African American Engineering majors at a rate of 4% to 8%²

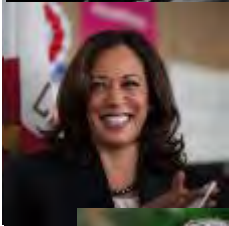

HISTORICALLY BLACK COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY TRANSFER AGREEMENT PROJECT

Guaranteed Admission for any California Community College student who completes one of the following:

- A transfer level Associate Degree* awarded by a California Community College with a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 or higher

(OR)

- A minimum 30 transferrable semester units with a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 or higher.

*The degree must include both the completion and certification of lower division Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) or the California State University General Education Breadth patternng (CSU GE)

ADDITIONAL PROGRAM ADVANTAGES

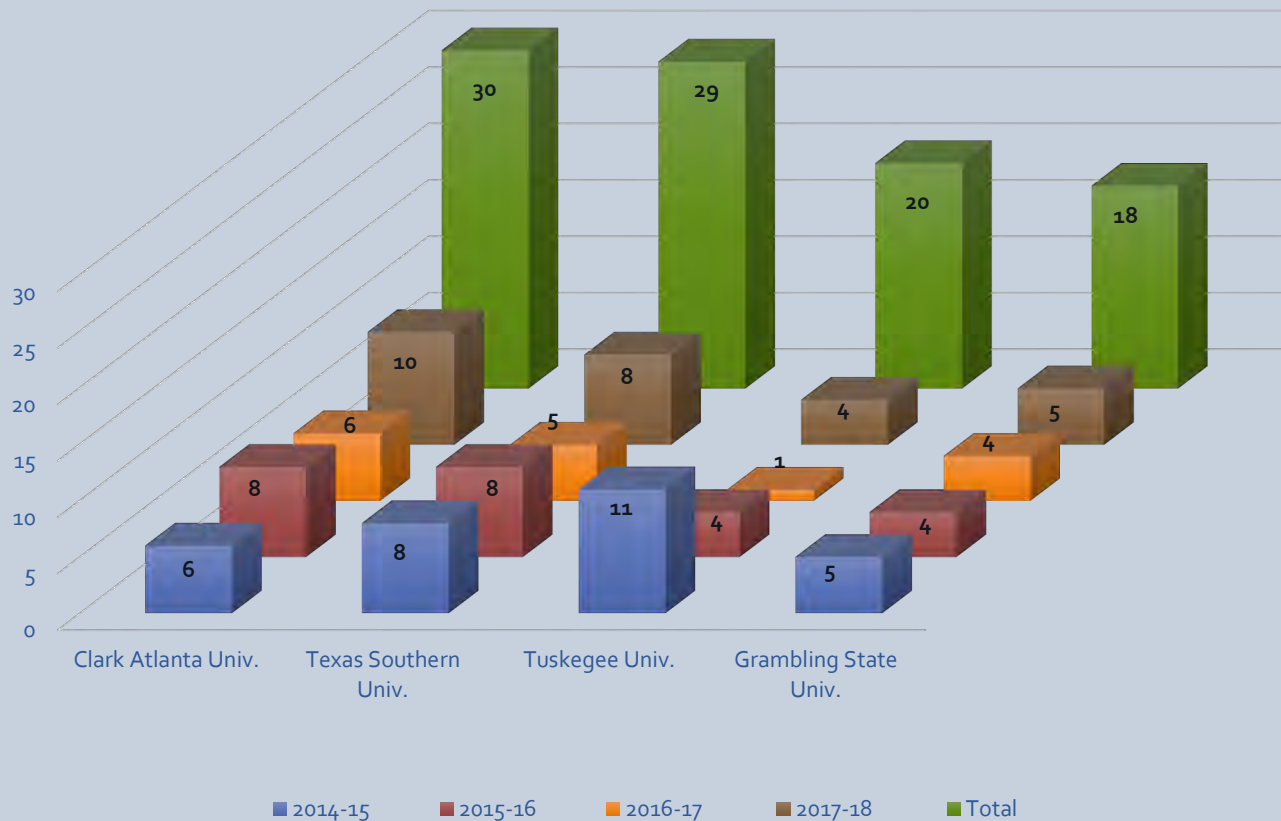

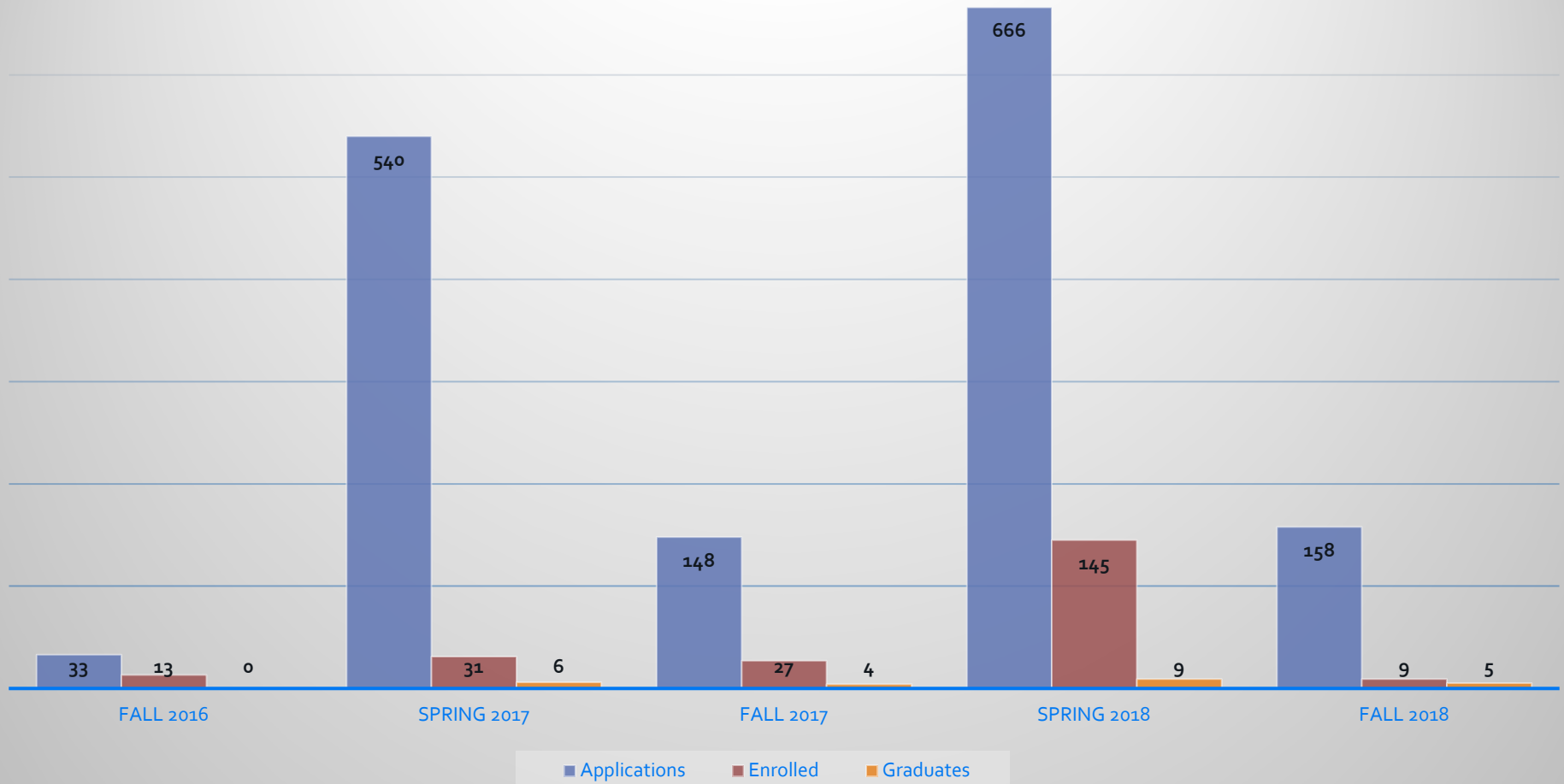

3. Meet with a counselor to evaluate all of your college transcripts.
4. Obtain the promo code from counselor to complete the online Common Black College Application (CBCA)- **ASAP**
5. For non-CBCA institutions – apply directly to the schools (on website).
6. Mail all official transcripts immediately to each school that you have applied.
7. Be sure to check the email account you provided on the application for updates and any additional requests.
