MINUTES

1. Review Minutes from May 2, 2022-Approved

2. President/CEO Items

a. COVID-19 Update

- i. Vice President Abe Ali said there was a slight increase in positive Covid cases. There were four reported cases and the campus experienced the first case that was spread within a six feet parameter that was breached. Abe Ali also said that they are working on making sure dates of test kits are up to date and marked.
- ii. Heather Parnock said that the Pandemic Coordinators are reviewing Los Angeles County Guidelines for Higher Education. There were minor changes in the wording of quarantine and isolation orders. Pandemic coordinators will provide a recommendation to Cabinet regarding whether the mask mandate will stay in place after summer, and they will also be looking at what other colleges are doing regarding the vaccine requirement. PPE may be delayed because Josh is out, but the checkpoint staff will be delivering this week.
- iii. Dr. Keith Curry concerned about changes other colleges are making regarding the vaccine requirement. Dr. Curry would like to have the vaccine requirement brought to the June Board meeting, but it is important that the Academic Senate and unions have conversations about it. But if other schools in our area are removing the vaccine requirement, we are not in the position to continue to require it because of our enrollment. LACCD is the first to announce the change. Dr. Minodora Moldoveanu will explore what other colleges are doing and this topic is on the agenda for the next Academic Senate meeting on May 19th. Vice President Sheri Berger shared a screen showing a Facebook page from Pierce College that states that effective May 5th vaccines are no longer required and effective June 12th masks are recommended but not required. Dr. Curry said we must look at our MOUs to see what it says about the vaccine and students. Abe Ali shared that among Human Resources the positive cases

are being associated with conferences and massive venues. Abe Ali recommends looking at how our staff and faculty are travelling to the conferences and what practices are in place at the conference. They should also be prepared to wear a mask and protect themselves. Abe Ali also stated that when employees go to a conference, they are covered by our workers compensation insurance, so we need to have good protocols in place.

- b. “The New Normal”
 - i. Heather Parnock said that they are working on categorizing recommendations into about ten categories and focusing on which new practices should be sustained and what was missing during the pandemic. A draft will be provided at Cabinet tomorrow.
- c. Campus Mural Projects
 - i. Dr. Moldoveanu said the task was delegated to a small committee and responded to emails about getting more student input. Dr. Moldoveanu sent an email to Chris Perez about having a student poll. Professor Vanessa Madrid sent Dr. Moldoveanu an email that supports Kendrick Lamar for the mural because of the attention from his long-awaited album that will be coming soon. There is media attention, a hip-hop blog, and interest in turning the mural into a mini documentary which is free advertising. Dr. Curry said that a process is the biggest concern to protect the district. ASG had a discussion about the mural and they are prepared to move forward. Sheri Berger also stated that maintenance of the mural needs to be discussed.

3. 2022-2023 Compton CCD Budget Assumptions

- a. Dr. Abdul Nasser shared a screen to show the tentative budget assumptions based on what the Governor proposed in January, but revisions will be made through June.
- b. The Summer Enrichment Activities is budgeted at \$100,000 but only shows \$55,000 because \$45,000 is budgeted in this current fiscal year.
- c. Amankwa McKinzie asked if this included the additional cost of the soil mitigation for the Physical Education Complex Replacement Project. Dr. Curry said yes and explained that \$3,000,000 is budgeted but that letters were sent to the State requesting funds and if additional funds are received from the State, then this will be removed from the budget assumptions.

4. Compton College Campaign Against Racism – Next Steps

- a. Dr. Curry wanted to give a reminder to all in this meeting and will discuss it further at next week’s meeting.

5. Other Items

- a. Vice President Nicole Jones said that faculty participation in the Enrollment Management Committee has been lacking and would like to find out what can be done to get more faculty participation. Dr. Moldoveanu will reach out to the faculty that are on the committee and will try to recruit additional faculty to participate.
- b. Stephanie Leonor shared that the second in-person event was held today and had a great turnout. Pictures will be sent to Heather Parnock to be posted on social media. An invite will be sent soon to the banquet on May 26th and is a black tie red carpet event
- c. Dr. Lauren Sosenko said that summer scholars summer institute has 34 students interested in Arizona State West June 12-21st; 42 students identified to attend UCI starting June 23rd; and 33 students interested in Clark Atlanta University beginning July 5th. Dr. Sosenko requested to share a draft of the student climate survey at next week’s meeting.
- d. 41 RSVPs were received for the Collegiality in Action workshop on Friday, May 13th and includes three faculty members, 19 classified staff, and 19 managers. Dr. Moldoveanu will send reminder to faculty and Chris Perez will send reminder to ASG.
