 - Don Mason motioned to approve agenda. Michael VanOverbeck seconded. Approved

 - Corina Diaz motioned to open item. Don Mason seconded
 - a) Vice President, Academic Affairs Sheri Berger
 - o Legislation that will impact curriculum:
 - AB 928: Common general education transfer pattern for UC/CSU. Goal of legislation is that we will have the common transfer pattern CalGETC by Fall 2025. Areas that will be impacted will be: Communication Studies (the UC will now require it), Arts and Humanities (area will be a 2 class requirement, from 9 units to 6 units), Ethnic Studies (area will be added as a requirement), Social Behavioral Sciences (will only need 2 courses), UC Language requirement will now be a graduation requirement not an general education admissions requirement (for UC), and Lifelong Learning (HDEV, PE, NUTR, CH etc.) will be removed from transfer pattern. CSU will now have lifelong learning as an upper division requirement

■ AB 1111: Common course numbering legislation might be coming up. There is nothing for us to do until there is more guidance. Concern is that we don't know what that means or how it will affect our curriculum

b) Curriculum Analyst – Maya Medina

Academic Affairs is working on January 2023 catalog addendum which will reflect curriculum changes that will be fully approved this term. Academic Affairs will be administratively correcting COR based on course inactivations that have been fully approved by Curriculum Committee, Academic Senate, and BOT; this will allow COR to reflect what is on the Chancellors Office Curriculum Inventory, in Banner, and what will be published in catalog. This would also mean that faculty would not have to do any extra work in curriculum

c) Articulation Officer – Melain McIntosh

- AB 928 also includes requirement for CCC's to automatically place students on ADT pathways. Three components to focus on: curriculum, implementation, and policy. Money is also set aside \$65 million for colleges to implement CalGETC. There will be automatic approval of updates for TMCs under 26 units if the college is only updating the new GE pattern in the TMC
 - Sean: AB 928- Is it going to affect non-ADT (for example CTE or AA/AS degrees)?
 - Sheri B.: Not if students in the AA/AS programs will be following the regular Compton College GE grad requirements. But, we also need to see how the new transfer pattern will impact our local GE. DEI GE area also needs to be implemented to local GE (ESTU grad requirement) but we haven't received guidance on that. It wont affect CTE. Students will still have the option to follow transfer GE or local GE for AS/AA. More guidance will need to be provided to see how we implement this by August 2024

d) SLOC – Jose Manuel Martinez

- We currently have 4 SLO facilitators, but 1 vacancy in FACH. Deadline to apply for FACH SLO facilitator was today.
- Every semester we collect SLO data (been collecting since SP 21); one issue to address is to make sure all faculty are reporting data. Have been discussing ways to encourage all faculty to submit data. After collecting data, we need to analyze the data from eLumen, write an action plan, and then implement the action plan.
- Jose shared the list of courses that need to do SLO Assessment in Fall 2022. Have already notified faculty in the courses
- o This semester, faculty will need to complete a PDF document Assessment Template (document reviewed in meeting)
- Work in Progress: Assessment Timeline. Faculty will need outline which courses and program learning outcomes will be assessed on a 4-year cycle
- Work in Progress: SLO data collection integration; hopefully data submission can be done in Canvas instead of having to go through eLumen
 - Sean M.: Regarding the FACH SLO facilitator opening, is the position restricted to faculty that work in FACH division
 - Sheri B: Two positions are currently open; FACH and HEPS. Faculty have to be in that division to be SLO facilitator.

- a) AA Social Justice Studies, LGBTQ+ Studies formally approval to be recommended by the Academic Senate on November 3, 2022.
 - Sheri B.: Clarification that Senate approved the concept of the degree not the actual Program (since we don't technically have the courses). They recommended that we move forward with creating the curriculum for the program.
