


## **Enrollment Update**


### Spring 2024 Term Total FTES Trend


# 2024-2025 CA BUDGET



## 2024-2025 California State Budget

- On January 10, 2024, Governor Newsom released his <u>budget proposal for the</u> <u>2024-2025</u> fiscal year.
  - Under the Governor's budget, total funding for the colleges would reach \$18.4 billion in 2024-25, a 2.8 percent increase over the revised 2023-24 level.
  - California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) <u>2024-2025 Joint Analysis of the Governor's Budget Proposal</u>.
  - On February 20, 2024, the <u>California Legislative Analyst's Office</u> (LAO) released the <u>2024-2025 Budget Deficit Update</u>, which projects the state deficit for 2024-2025 at **\$73** billion and mentions that "[the] Budget problem is likely to be higher at the time of the May Revision."
  - LAO released the <u>2024-2025 California Community Colleges Brief</u>, which analyzes Governor Gavin Newsom's budget proposals relating to California Community Colleges enrollment, apportionments, and nursing education.

# STUDENT SUCCESS



## Student Success and Retention

**Census Date:** The date on which the number of students enrolled in a course is considered official for state reporting and funding. A student enrolled in a course on or after this date receives a final course grade.

**Retention Rate:** The retention rate is the percentage of students who remain enrolled through the end of a course out of all students enrolled on census date. In essence, it is the percentage of students who did not drop late or withdraw.

**Success Rate:** The success rate is the percentage of students who receive an A, B, C, P or IPP (In Progress Passing) as a final course grade out of all students enrolled as of the census date.



# Institution-Set Goals and Standards

**Institution-Set Goals:** College-wide goals for student enrollment, course success, persistence, award completion, and transfer.

- e.g. <u>Course Success Rate</u> 2023-2024 goals (compared to <u>Fall</u> 2022 update):
  - Course Success Rate: 74% (68%)
  - In-person Course Success Rate: 74% (81%)
  - Distance Ed Course Success Rate: 67% (63%)

**Institution-Set Standard:** College-wide standard for student success that we strive to meet and exceed annually.


Course Success Rate I-SS: 62.6%
