




Winter 2024 Term Total Enrollment (Seats Filled) Trend


Winter 2024 Term Total FTES Trend

Winter 2024 Term Unique Headcount Trend




















HEALTH PROFESSIONS PARTNERSHIP



Compton Community Health Professions Partnership

- Purpose & Scope:
 - Increase interest in healthcare professions
 - Increase the number of healthcare professionals from the greater Compton community working in the community
 - Energize young people to return to their community through engagement
 - Create a partnership model that can be replicated in similar communities nationwide
- Three Phases: September 6, 2023 through June 30, 2028
- Action Steps: Fall 2023 Spring 2026, ongoing
 - Public forums to hear firsthand from the people who are experiencing barriers to healthcare or entering healthcare professions
 - Engagement and recruitment activities
 - Creation of training and clinical rotation sites
 - Data collection on enrollment, completion and employment

- Currently offering classes at adult schools
- President/CEO visits to Compton, Lynwood, and Paramount unified school district adult schools
- Increase successful enrollment of adult learners (aged 20+) (<u>Adult Learner SEM Plan</u>)




Accreditation Update

Student Success and Retention


Retention Rate: The retention rate is the percentage of students who remain enrolled through the end of a course out of all students enrolled on census date (definition below). In essence, it is the percentage of students who did not drop late or withdraw.

Success Rate: The success rate is the percentage of students who receive an A, B, C, P or IPP as a final course grade out of all students enrolled as of the census date.
