#### **Scorecard Definitions**


- COLLEGE PREPARED: Student's lowest course attempted in Math and/or writing was college level




# Less than 1 out of 5 basic skills students finish transfer-level math





# 1.5 out of 5 basic skills reading students finish transfer-level English






# 2 out of 5 basic skills writing students finish transfer-level English

Transfer Level Course Completion Within 3 Years










## Percentage of Cohort Unprepared for College



#### Institution Set Standards

Standards are thresholds that we do not want to dip below.

Standard criteria selected by the Strategic Planning Committee was one standard deviation below the lowest performing year (in the last five years of available data) or one standard deviation below the five year average. Meaning a majority of students performed above this level over the last five years.


