

Accreditation

- Compton College was granted initial accreditation by the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) on June 7, 2017.
- Mid-term report due to ACCJC by March 15, 2020.
 - October 22, 2020 Mid-Term Report Draft available online at http://www.compton.edu/campusinformation/accreditation/
- Institutional Self-Evaluation Report due to ACCJC in January 2024 with an Accreditation Visit by an External Evaluation Team scheduled for spring of 2024.





2021-2021 LEGISLATIVE AGENDA



2021-2022 Compton College Legislative Agenda

- Request to the Department of Finance to extend Compton College Full-Time Equivalent Students (FTES) protection at 5,980 through 2028-2029.
- Request continued support of funding for Student Equity and Achievement.
 - The 2020-2021 budget of \$2.3 million is supporting the Student Success Initiatives at Compton College.
- Request additional funds to support Compton Community College District general operating funds to address pension and instructional costs.



2021-2022 Compton College Legislative Agenda

- Request \$27 million to support student residential housing at Compton College for 100 beds.
 - This will be for the first phase of housing at Compton College.
- Request additional funds to support Compton Community College District COVID-19 related expenses.
