The Compton College District Police Department (CCDPD) is the primary law enforcement agency for the College and ensures that reasonable protection is available to members of the College community and the property of the District. They achieve this by employing methods that align with and contribute to the College's educational philosophy and processes, such as community policing and crime prevention programs.

Police Department personnel are always available, 24 hours a day, to ensure the safety and security of Compton College's campus, providing a constant sense of protection to the college community.

To report an emergency or criminal activity on or near the campus, you can dial ext. 2999 or 911 on the emergency blue poles located throughout the campus. If you are using a cell phone or off-campus telephone, call 310-900-1600 ext. 2790. Additionally, you can sign up for Nixle Notifications to receive emergency alerts on your cell phone. To do this, text the keyword 'CCPD1' to 888777 to start receiving alerts via text message.

Campus Police patrol the Compton College campus and provide students and staff with many services, including:

- Patrol Services (Vehicle, Foot, & Bicycle Patrol, Detective Bureau, and Traffic/Vehicle Enforcement);
- Dispatch Services (Alarm/CCTV Monitoring, Emergency Blue Poles, Campus Safety Alerts, Emergency Campus Alerts, and Crime Reporting);
- Lobby Services (Phone Charging Station, Student Assistance, Campus Information, General Information);
- Preparing and investigating crime and incident reports;

- Operating the campus "lost and found" service; and
- Providing student and staff escort services.

For general information and non-emergency police services, the CCDPD office is just a call away. Office hours are Monday through Friday, 6 a.m. to 10 p.m. (subject to change without notice).
