




# Compton College Students – Safe Return to Campus Survey


May 24, 2021

In May 2021, Compton College surveyed all current students about their beliefs regarding returning to campus for in-person instruction. 600 students responded (approximately 16% response rate). Surveys were administered via email through CRM Advise, and administered for a two-week period with one reminder email.


## Are you currently taking classes virtually?




# When Compton College opens up to in-person classes, what classes do you want to take?

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

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

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Please indicate your level of agreement for the following statements about your perception of Compton College's ability to bring students back to campus and your attitudes about safely returning to campus.




**Please rate your level of fear related to COVID-19 infection:**

## What other concerns do you have about returning to work on campus?

Desire of safety protocols (e.g., Cleanliness, resources, adequate classroom space) and the concern that it will be difficult to enforce/satisfy, "I'm concerned that restrooms and classrooms won't be sanitized properly. I've been a student at Compton College and attended the campus and at times the restrooms looked and smelled like they hadn't been properly cleaning in days. I also worry that students will not want to follow safety procedures. As well as the school not having enough supplies so that all students don't have to share items and what not," while another student said, "People not feeling well and still coming to class, people being malicious and spitting on elevator you don't know about it you touch it now you are taking the virus home to your family...," "Most classes before COVID were very full to the point where some students didn't have a seat. I am concerned about being about to actually social distance. In theory it seems good, but in reality, especially with the overpopulated science classes social distancing just seems impossible." (43)

Risk of catching COVID, other variations of COVID, "Don't feel safe returning back to campus, especially in a classroom with other students. I feel 100% safer at home, don't have to worry about students coughing and sneezing and contracting the covid- 19 virus and bringing it home to my young children." (34)

No concerns about returning to school/None (30)

Fear of bringing COVID home, "Bringing the virus home to my children," "Getting covid and bringing it home to my grandmother she's all I have" (15)

Needing flexibility with work and family or just appreciating the flexibility of remote learning, "Some of my fears are I will have to spend more money on gas. Don't want to be forced or uncomfortable following safety protocols or to be vaccinated, "Being uncomfortable wearing a mask for a long time in a 5 hour classroom setting with 36 students," "The only concern I have he being forced to get vaccinated" (8)

Other concerns (e.g., getting transcripts, parking, availability of classes, school shootings, fear of being behind academically) (4)

Money, work, cost of being on campus, "Do to covid19 i have not been able to find work at this time and would need money to travel to campus and from campus." (2)


Hard time adjusting to classes and work schedule, "I WOULD LIKE THE COLLEGE TO OFFER ONLINE CLASSES FOR FALL SEMESTER FOR WORKING PARENTS AND WITH CHILDCARE ISSUES.I have been doing very well with my online classes and would love to continue online for fall 2021," or "the smooth transition from online to in campus teaching. This entire Nursing path has been poor due to disappointing communication from faculty and students. The management of this communication is often done "last minute" with a "take it or leave it" ideology." (2)

Air ventilation, "That it won't be safe enough and with the possibility of getting the COVID-19 since we're going to be in a classroom with no free air from the outside ventilation that's my concern." (1)

## Do you have any final comments about the return to campus?

Ease of studying at home online or flexibility of in-person and online learning, "I don't want to return to campus. Dealing with parking issues, being at school late at night. Being in lecture for 4+ hours in an uncomfortable chair. I like online school it's easier by being home and don't have to drive to campus for class I can spend more time with my family. Being able to get grades ASAP is also a plus with online classes. Add more online option classes with zero campus" (33)

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Concern about people adhering to safety protocols, "A concern I have is peers not following social distancing or keeping their masks on while on campus. If a student is covid positive while attending, how will they quarantine and continue with their studies if class is on campus. I am also concerned about the possibility of an outbreak. This will be adding stress during our studies especially during this fall with the flu season and covid-19." (23)

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Opening to early, "I feel that the campus should remain closed for the 2021 semester and work on reopening for spring 2022 while people are still getting vaccinated, and wait for number cases reported to further go down," "Fall is coming that is when people start getting sick from the flu etc. Scared that another wave of a new variant might come and spread around the campus. 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Desire for in-person lab classes or people who just learn better in person, "I think it is crucial that certain majors are able to go to campus. Skill based majors are at a learning deficit because of campus closure and inability to practice skills consistently." (5)

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People should not be forced to come back to campus or to get vaccinated (5)

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Afraid of family getting sick (3)

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Want access to campus resources, "I am looking forward of returning back to campus and have library access to study." (2)

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Want smaller class size (1)

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Need to be in-person for better availability, "many times I do not get emails answered worse will be in person do to the wait time or non-availability" (1)
