In 2018-19, the California Community College Chancellor's Office released the new Student Centered Funding Formula that funds colleges partially for student performance, including completing 9 or more Career Technical Education (CTE) units and conferred certificates (16+ units). While Compton College has six years of stable guaranteed funding, time is of the essence to review and understand how the College will fare under this new formula. To inform the college about how best to support student success in the future, the Office Institutional Research (IR) presents findings about Compton student certificate completion and 3-8 unit completion from the last three academic years. This report provides findings from this inquiry and recommendations for next steps.

What certificates are conferred at Compton College? Where might we grow our certificate offering?

Table 1 includes whether or not the certificate is offered at Compton College, the minimum number of units required to receive the certificate, and the number of awards granted to Compton College students over the last three years (i.e., from 2015-16 to 2017-18). These data are pulled from the Chancellor's Office MIS award data.

Findings

- Air Conditioning & Refrigeration, Childhood Education, and Automotive Technology produce the most certificates.
- Five certificates (highlighted in yellow in the table) would qualify for funding under the new funding formula and had ten or more completers in the last three years and are not currently offered at Compton College. Faculty may consider if they want to develop these certificates through the curriculum process.

How many students are earning low levels of CTE units? Where might we grow our certificate offering?

Table 2 reflects the number of students earning between 3 and 8 units in a CTE discipline anytime between 2012-13 and 2016-17, who did not receive a program award, and were not enrolled in any coursework as of the 2017-18 academic year. These course enrollment data were mined from local course enrollment data.

Findings

• Hundreds to thousands of students earn between 3-8 CTE units without earning a program award. Faculty may consider how to encourage these students to take 9 units or pursue a completion in any area.

Note: This table reflects students who received 3 to 8 CTE units between 2012-13 and 2016-17 but did not enroll in the 2017-18 academic year. Students with coursework in multiple CTE programs but fewer than 9 units in each program are counted multiple times (once for each program where they received between 3 and 8 units).

Next Steps

 Faculty need to understand these data in relation to their own programs to consider how they can contribute to Compton College success under the new funding formula. IR will post this report to the planning website so that faculty can consider it when deciding which curriculum and awards to develop.

•	College committees should consider how to encourage students to complete the 9^{th} unit of CTE education if it will support student outcomes and their ability to earn a living wage.
