✓ THE CHALLENGE

Compton is medically underserved and faces:

- High rates of obesity, diabetes, cancer, STDs, and depression
- 58% of residents live below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level
- Low higher education attainment rates
- Limited clinical training sites
- 1,000+ open healthcare positions
- Severe shortage of healthcare professionals
- Underrepresentation of Black and Brown professionals in healthcare roles

1. Increase local student interest in healthcare careers.
2. Train and employ healthcare workers from Compton, in Compton.
3. Build a replicable model for community-based health workforce development.
4. Foster long-term change in community health outcomes.

✓ HOW IT WORKS – THE PIPELINE

MIDDLE SCHOOL → HIGH SCHOOL → COLLEGE → CAREER

- Early engagement and health career exposure
- Dual enrollment and recruitment into healthcare tracks
- Clinical rotation sites and local training opportunities
- Employment in local clinics (St. John's, Kedren, and Watts Health Center)
- Community forums and legislative advocacy

✓ SHORT-TERM OUTCOMES

- More Black/Latino students enrolled in health programs
- Increase in graduates from local colleges in health fields
- Expanded clinical training sites
- Better engagement between schools, clinics and community
- More community forums and health awareness

✓ LONG-TERM IMPACTS

- More culturally relevant care
- Better access and health outcomes for marginalized groups
- Economic mobility through career pathways
- A model of vertically integrated community health training
- A healthier, self-empowered Compton
