

First-Time College Students Attend Compton College NEARLY FREE

In fall 2023, Compton College's Oliver W. Conner Promise Program was expanded to include all first-time college students regardless of age. Those who have never taken college classes* and meet the eligibility criteria will have their \$46 per unit enrollment fees (full- or part-time) waived for up to two years (up to 15 credits per term).

High School Students Enrolled in College Courses

Compton College's 12-in-4 Program offers high school freshmen a pathway to earn a minimum of 12 college credits (3-4 classes) by the time they graduate from high school in four years. All area high school students may take dual enrollment classes any time during high school.

Since 2018, 7,623 students from local high schools have taken advantage of the dual enrollment opportunities at Compton College.

Dual enrollment is a cost-effective way for high school students to earn college credits. Enrollment fees are waived for California residents, and K-12 students participating in the following dual enrollment programs can also receive class materials, such as textbooks, at no cost.

Improving Our Campus

The Compton Community College District has had success seeking state and local funds for capital improvements to ensure improved facilities and educational opportunities for our students; Compton College's campus continues to improve with funds from Measure CC (2022) and Measure C (2014) supported by voters.

New Construction:

Instructional Building 1

\$22.3 million, completed fall 2021

Student Services Building

\$25.2 million, completed spring 2023

Instructional Building 2

\$25.6 million, completed spring 2024



Future Projects:

Student Housing

- \$80.4 million funded by 2022-23 state grant under AB183
- Est. completion winter 2026
- 250-bed student housing facility, new construction

Visual & Performing Arts Complex

- \$16 million, Est. completion fall 2026
- One-story building will house music, theater and dance programs and upgrade the Little Theater

Physical Education Complex

- \$45.6 million, Est. completion spring 2028
- Replacement of existing PE Complex including a new pool



Financial Aid & Scholarships

Financial aid in the form of grants, work-study, loans, and scholarships is one way to reduce the cost of attending college.

In 2022-2023, 24,800 students received financial aid. The majority was distributed through grants, including the California College Promise Grant and Federal Pell Grants.

Over the last five years, more than 450 Compton College students have received a total of \$176,200 in scholarships.

Addressing Basic Needs

To remove barriers to education, Compton College has expanded or added new resources in the last five years to ensure students' basic needs are met.

Free student resources include:

- Parking permits
- Metro GoPass for transportation
- Laptop computer, Wi-Fi, and headphone loans
- One meal per day at the on-campus Everytable Café
- \$20/week in vouchers for the on-campus farmers' market
- Access to printing
- Blue books and Scantrons
- Access to on-campus food pantry and locker rooms for showers



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Compton College Receives Reaffirmed Accreditation Status

The Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges has reaffirmed Compton College's accreditation for seven years. The college received two commendations for its exemplary work in planning, goal setting, access, and creating programs that support students:

- Standard IV.B.1, IV.B.3, IV.B.6: The Commission commends the chief executive officer's leadership in organizational planning, institutional goal setting, and fostering strategic community partnerships that have improved student success through enhanced access to basic needs.
- Standard II.B.1, II.C.3: The Commission commends the college for its prioritization and institutional commitment in developing and sustaining transformative student supports that are essential to student success and ensure equitable educational access to all students.
