Compton College Promise: Local High School Grads Get Two Years Free

High school graduates from the Compton, Lynwood, and Paramount unified school districts who attend Compton College full time (12 units) immediately after graduation are eligible to have their enrollment fees paid for two years at Compton College -- a savings of \$1,840 per year!

The two years of paid enrollment fees include the fall semester, winter term, spring semester and summer sessions at Compton College. Students can choose from a variety of educational pathways: earn an associate degree and/or certificate, transfer to a four-year college or university, or pursue shorter-term job training through our Career Education program.

NEW! Weekly Certified Farmers' Market

Wednesdays, 3:00 to 7:30 p.m. at Compton College

Compton College hosts a certified farmers' market in partnership with Sustainable Economic Enterprises of Los Angeles (SEE-LA) on Wednesdays, from 3:00 to 7:30 p.m. along the Main Loop on campus.

The market features popular programs including the Los Angeles County-supported American Rescue Plan Market Match, a healthy food incentive program that makes fruits and vegetables more affordable through a dollar-for-dollar match on EBT purchases. Attendees may also use their CalFresh EBT benefits, WIC, and Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program checks (FMNP) to purchase groceries. In addition, CalFresh can be used toward ARP Market Match incentives to receive up to \$20 to buy fruits and vegetables at the market.

Students, employees, and members of the community are invited to shop for fruits and vegetables, meats and fish, and other packaged food directly from local farmers.

New Academic Programs at Compton College

In the past couple of years, Compton College has introduced some exciting and relevant programs to meet the demands of today's workforce. Because these classes are popular and fill up quickly, interested students are advised to plan ahead and register for classes as early as possible! (Certain classes may not be offered every semester.)



Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA)

Compton College is offering a new Certified Nursing Assistant program to accommodate students looking to pursue careers in allied health and technical fields and fill the gap in employment of much-needed health care workers. The eight-week course prepares students for entry-level health care positions in a long-term care skilled nursing facility. Upon successful completion of the course, students are eligible to take the State of California Certified Nursing Assistant certification examination. Certified nursing assistants enter at the first level of the nursing career ladder and report directly to a licensed vocational nurse or registered nurse.

Apple Coding

In partnership with Apple, Compton College now offers Apple Swift Coding courses through its Computer Information Systems Department. Swift is

one of the world's most popular programming languages. The five nontransferable courses offered at Compton College give students the opportunity to learn to code and design fully functional apps, gaining critical job skills in software development and information technology.

Esports

Compton College introduced its first intercollegiate esports course during the 2022-2023 academic year. The college looks to offer a varsity program and compete in the National Association of Collegiate Esports (NACE), providing students the opportunity to compete against more than 175 colleges and universities across the nation. The program is open to all students and consists of both personal computer (PC) and console video gaming. For Those Who Need Extra Support

Compton College offers Extended Opportunity Programs and Services (EOPS) for eligible students who want to get an education, but do not have the resources to enroll in college. EOPS is a state-funded program that helps students, 18 years and older, who are economically and educationally disadvantaged.

EOPS students receive many benefits including priority registration, referrals to student support services, educational supplies, transfer assistance, student enhancement workshops, book vouchers, transportation assistance, academic achievement grants, and more.

"The Compton College EOPS Office has an exceptional staff," said Claudia Blandino, a 2021 Compton College graduate who transferred to California State University, Dominguez Hills as a sociology major. "Use this program if you are eligible and you will for sure graduate. The EOPS counselors are very comprehensive, guide students every step of the way, and will ensure you earn your degree and graduate."

CalFresh Food Assistance

Budgets can be limited for many college students, which is why Compton College connects students to CalFresh and other resources that can help ease financial burdens.

Compton College offers students the opportunity to apply for CalFresh, a state program providing monthly food/grocery vouchers and/or Medi-Cal benefits!

Two of five students are eligible to receive benefits and don't even know it! CalFresh awards up to \$234 a month for groceries and the application process usually takes less than 15 minutes. Monthly Mobile Food Pantry

In partnership with the Los Angeles Regional Food Bank, Compton College currently hosts a public Mobile Food Pantry on campus the second Tuesday of each month.

Food is distributed on a first-come first-served basis, and attendees can expect to receive 25-40 pounds of food. The Mobile Food Pantry is open from 1-3 p.m. in Parking Lot F, accessed from Greenleaf Boulevard.



Steps to Enrollment

Fall 2023 Applications currently being accepted online at compton.edu

APPLY - Take the first step - it's fast and easy! Complete and submit our free application online.

PREPARE - Orientation provides an introduction to academic programs and support services to help you succeed.

PLAN - Focus on your goal! Meet with a counselor and complete an educational plan to identify classes that are required to complete your certificate, degree or transfer program.

REGISTER - Ready to register for classes? Login to MyCompton and register for classes on or after your assigned Ticket Time (registration appointment).

Apply for Financial Aid!

A variety of aid is available for all income levels. Whether or not you think you are eligible, we encourage all students to apply for financial aid each year to help pay for college expenses.

Eligibility requirements include that you are a U.S. citizen or eligible noncitizen. For more information, please visit <u>studentaid.gov/understand-aid/eligibility</u>.

The first step in applying for student aid is to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or the California Dream Act Application (CADAA) for AB 540 students. Both applications are free.

When applying, you will be asked to enter a Compton College code. For the FAFSA, use Compton College code 042817; on the CADAA, use Compton College code 04281700.

Important Dates & Deadlines

October 1

- Complete the FAFSA or CADAA
- Get help at a Cash for College workshop

March 2

Priority financial aid filing deadline for most colleges and universities and the absolute deadline for submission of your Cal Grant application (FAFSA or CADAA + GPA)

After March 2

The FAFSA and CADAA are accepted throughout the year. Check with the Compton College Financial Aid Office for more information, 310-900-1600, Ext. 2935.
