History of Compton Community College District

- The Compton Community College was established in 1927 as a component of the Compton Union High School District.
- In 1950, voters approved a bond issue separating the college from the high school district.
- Classes began on the new campus in fall 1956.



History of Compton Community College District

- On June 7, 2017, the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) granted initial accreditation status to Compton College. The action established Compton College as an accredited college within the El Camino Community College District.
- Compton College was officially named the 114th California Community College through unanimous vote by the Board of Governors in July 2017. On August 29, 2018, California Community Colleges Chancellor Eloy Oakley issued Executive Order 2018-01 declaring Compton College will operate as an independent college under the authority of the Compton Community College District (CCCD) Board of Trustees effective June 7, 2019 at 11:59 p.m.




Compton College At A Glance



Compton CCD Demographics













Age by Ethnicity

















New Instructional Building 1

\$21.2 million state-of-the-art instructional building





Current Construction Projects

Instructional Building 2: The \$25.6 million project involves the removal of Row Building D, and the remainder of Row E and F buildings, and construction of a second state-of-the-art instructional building on campus. Estimated Completion: Winter 2023





Current Construction Projects

Student Services Building: The \$25.2 million facility will become a one-stop hub for all student services. The project involves the demolition of the old Library building, and construction of the new Student Services Building. Estimated Completion: Fall 2022





Future Construction Projects

Compton College Physical Education Complex: This \$45.6 million project includes the demolition of the current gymnasium, men's shower/locker, classroom V, pool service, pool, and women's shower/locker buildings; and the construction of a new gymnasium, men's and women's locker room, faculty office space, and physical education support space.





Future Construction Projects


Compton College Visual and Performing Arts Complex: This \$13.4 million project includes a new facility to support music, dance, performing arts, film and video programs. Strategic placement of this new facility, adjacent to the renovated Little Theater, provides space for an outdoor courtyard.





Future Construction Projects

On June 26, 2022, California lawmakers moved to include a student housing grant totaling \$80,389,000 in the 2022-2023 State Budget for the Compton Community College District (CCCD) to build its proposed **250-bed student housing facility on the Compton College campus**.




- The proposed Compton College student housing will be located at the northeast corner of campus.
- Phase one of the 86,000-square-foot building will include four floors of affordable student living quarters with 100 percent occupancy earmarked for eligible low-income students.
- The facility will provide three types of living configurations: 50 double-room units with access to shared bathrooms and common spaces, 50 double-suite units with bathrooms and access to common spaces, and 50 studio units for single occupants for a combined total of 250 beds.
- Amenity spaces will include study areas/lounges, and shared kitchens.
- Phase two of this student housing project will include an additional 200 beds with a mix of double and single occupancy units.

The final report on the Gates-funded initiative states:

In 2011, nine colleges joined the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation on a student success initiative called Completion by Design (CBD). They all shared the premise that addressing the problem of completion requires a long-term, large-scale approach. These colleges recognized they could have a significant positive impact on student success rates if they were willing to redesign their entire institutions around degree completion. Six years later, the student experience at these colleges looks markedly different. (p.3)
