



Compton College Glance

- Compton College enrollment reached 11,510 students in 2018-2019.




CCCD Demographics





Compton College Ethnicity








Figure 1. Trend in Total Number of Compton College Employees





Compton College Population by Employee Group


Figure 3. Fall 2019 Compton College Employee Population by Employee Group





Compton College Employees -Gender Distribution


Figure 4. Trend in Gender Distribution of Compton College Employees

Figure 7. Trend in Ethnic Group Distribution of Compton College Employees



- Continue to engage the Campus Community in diversity activities.







FACILITIES UPDATE



Completed Facilities Projects

The Compton Community College District grounds continue to improve thanks to funds from Measure CC and Measure C supported by voters in 2002 and 2014, respectively. Projects completed in the last three years include:

- **Student Health Center:** installation of a modular building to house the Student Health Center. Completed: March 2017.
- **Music Building North Wing & Little Theater:** the \$3 million Music Building renovation project included upgrades to the 220-seat Little Theater. Completed: December 2016.
- **Cosmetology Facility:** installation of a modular building in Tartar Village to house the new cosmetology program. Completed: August 2016.



Completed Facilities Projects

- Allied Health Building: construction on a new \$12 million, state-of-the-art Allied Health Building to house the nursing and child development programs. Completed: December 2015
- **Football Stadium and Track:** renovation of the existing football field and track and installation of new synthetic turf on the field. Completed: September 2015
- **Public Safety Building:** a groundbreaking ceremony occurred in July 2018 for construction of a \$4.7 million, all-new building to house the Compton District Police Department. Estimated Completion: July 2019.



Current Construction Projects




- Instructional Building 1: The \$18.8 million project includes the removal of Row Buildings G, half of F, two-thirds of E, and Modular Buildings M1 and M2 (total of six structures) and replace them with a new, state-of-the-art instructional building. Estimated Completion: Spring 2021
- Instructional Building 2: The \$25.6 million project involves the removal of Row Building D, and the remainder of Row E and F buildings, and construction of a second state-of-the-art instructional building on campus. Estimated Completion: Fall 2021
- **Student Services Building:** The \$20.4 million facility will become a onestop hub for all student services. The project involves the demolition of the old Library building, and construction of the new Student Services Building. Estimated Completion: Winter 2022.



Future Projects

• Compton College Physical Education Complex: This \$46 million project includes the demolition of the current gymnasium, men's shower/locker, classroom V, pool service, pool, and women's shower/locker buildings; and the construction of a new gymnasium, men's and women's locker room, faculty office space, and physical education support space.
