Growth Mindset

Framed without an equity lens:

I will teach students to internalize that working hard, making mistakes, and taking risks are essential parts of the learning process.

Framed with an equity lens:

I will foster a growth mindset classroom where students from all backgrounds and identities feel:

- (1) safe to experiment, take risks, and make mistakes*
- (2) invited to communicate their unique approaches and perspectives*
- (3) free to develop their own identities as powerful lifelong learners.*
