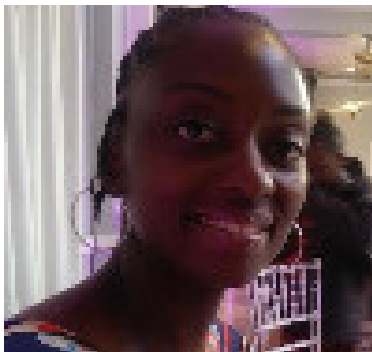

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EOPS Frequently Asked Questions

Q. When will I receive my book voucher?

A. Students must first meet with an EOPS counselor to receive approval for the book voucher (Only courses on the educational plan will be approved)

Q. What is the book voucher amount?

A. Minimum \$600.00

Q. When is the graduation ceremony?

A. The commencement ceremony is held once a year during the spring semesters typically in June.

Q. I have completed my 1st contact what do I need to do now in order to obtain my book voucher

A. Check your MyCompton email for an approval letter, if received stop by the bookstore with a picture ID to obtain your books.

Q. If I don't use all my book voucher funding, can I use it toward another purchase?

A. Unfortunately no, book vouchers are used to purchase required books any unused amount will be returned to the EOPS program

**3rd. Counseling Contact (Priority Registration)-
Monday, October 27- Thursday, December 11**

Q. How many counseling contacts are required for Fall 2025?

A. Three (3) Counseling Contacts are required.

Q. How do I schedule counseling contacts?

A. Schedule appointments by calling (310-900-1600, ext. 2912 or visiting the EOPS Office (SSB 280).

Q. What are the deadlines for counseling contacts?

1st Contact: Monday, Aug. 11 - Thursday, Oct. 9

2nd Contact: Monday, Sept. 29 - Thursday, Oct. 30

3rd Contact: Monday, Oct. 27 - Thursday, Dec. 11

You Can Transfer!

- **Who** can apply for transfer?
 - All students have the potential to transfer. If you are interested in transferring, you do have to meet certain requirements - meet with your EOPS/CARE/Next Up counselors to review requirements.
 - **What** resources are there to help me?
 - At Compton College, there is the transfer center in SSB, 266. They host workshops to teach you how to transfer and host university tours. EOPS/CARE/NextUp counselors will guide and help you.
 - **Where** can I transfer?
 - Your options are broad. You can transfer to different universities like the CSUs, UCs, HBCUs, private universities and out-of-state universities. Local universities to Compton College include CSU Long Beach, CSU Dominguez Hills, University of California Los Angeles (UCLA), CSU Fullerton and more!
 - **When** do I apply for transfer?
 - There are different application cycles. The common application period is during the Fall semester is Aug. 1 and Nov. 30 of each year. *Deadlines are subject to change.*
 - **How** do I apply to transfer?
 - Complete online applications through each university's website. For CSU campuses, use Cal State Apply; for UC campuses, use the UC Application website at apply.universityofcalifornia.edu.

Why did you attend Compton College?

I chose to attend Compton College because I wanted to pursue my education in an environment that truly values community support and second chances. Compton College has a strong reputation for helping students achieve their goals, and I was inspired by the many success stories I heard from others in the community who attended and went on to do great things.

I often heard people speak highly of the college's dedicated staff and counselors, the supportive atmosphere, and the resources available to help students thrive both academically and personally. How long did it take you to finally decide on a major?

Choosing social work came naturally—it aligned with both my values and my purpose.

What impact did the EOPS program have on your educational journey?

They guided me through class selections, answered every question, and helped me stay focused on my academic goals. Their experience and encouragement made me feel confident and capable, even during the most challenging times.

What made EOPS truly special was the genuine passion the staff had for student success. They provided the supplies I needed, offered one-on-one support, and always made me feel seen and valued. Their dedication went beyond academics—specifically, Ms. Blake believed in me, and that belief helped me believe in myself.

Did you face any obstacles while obtaining your associate degree from Compton College?

Yes, I faced several obstacles while obtaining my associate degree. Being a single parent and working a full-time job while attending school full-time was incredibly challenging. Balancing responsibilities at home, work, and in the classroom often felt overwhelming, and there were times I questioned whether I could keep going.

Despite the difficulties, I stayed focused on my goals and reminded myself why I started. With determination and the support of the EOPS program, I was able to push through. It wasn't easy, but every sacrifice was worth it to build a better future for myself and my daughter.

Did you find the transfer process difficult?

Yes and no—the transfer process had its challenges, but I also took steps to prepare myself. I made sure I had the right classes and enough units to earn my CSU certification, which helped make the technical side smoother. I stayed focused on meeting the academic requirements.

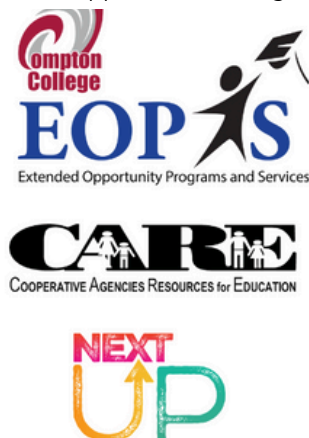
However, as a first-generation college student, the emotional side was harder. I didn't have much knowledge about how the process worked, and there was a real fear of whether I'd be accepted or rejected. But through prayer, faith, hard work, and the incredible support of Ms. Blake and the EOPS staff, I got through it. Ms. Blake's guidance and patience made a big difference, and I'm proud of how far I've come.

What are your career goals?

My career goals are to earn my master's degree in social work and continue pouring back into the community that helped shape me. I want to advocate for those who feel unheard, provide support to individuals and families in need, and truly make a difference in people's lives. For me, social work isn't just a career—it's a calling and a way to fulfill my purpose in life.

In the future, I'm also thinking about opening my own small therapy center. I want to create a safe space where people from all walks of life can access the support and healing they deserve. My goal is to uplift, empower, and be a resource for lasting change in the community.
